BYLAW NO 1/13

A BYLAW TO CONTROL THE PARKING OF A MOTOR VEHICLE IN A SPACE DESIGNATED FOR PEOPLE WITH A DISABILITY.

The Council of the Town of Hanley in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:


1. This bylaw will be known as the Disability Parking Bylaw.
2. For the purpose of this bylaw the word:
 - a) Permit means a parking permit issued by the Saskatchewan Abilities Council to a person with a disability;
 - b) Vehicle means a vehicle, or semi-trailer or a motor vehicle as ascribed to by *The Traffic Safety Act*;
 - c) Council means the Council of the Town of Hanley; and
 - d) Municipality means the Town of Hanley.
3. No person shall stop or park a motor vehicle in a designated parking space for people with disabilities without an authorized permit suspended from the rearview mirror and visible through the front windshield of the vehicle.
4.
 - (a) Where the Designated Officer believes that a person has contravened section 3 of this Bylaw, he may serve upon such person a Bylaw Violation Notice as provided by this section either personally or by mailing or leaving same at his last known address and such service shall be adequate for the purpose of this bylaw.
 - (b) Such notice shall be deemed to have been served:
 - a. On the expiration of twenty-four hours after it is posted, if the notice is mailed;
 - b. On the day of actual delivery, if the notice is served personal; or
 - c. On the business day following the transmission, if given by facsimile.
 - (c) A Bylaw Violation Notice shall be in such form as determined in Schedule A and shall state the section of the Bylaw, which was contravened, and the amount, which is provided in subsection (f) that will be accepted by the Municipality in lieu of prosecution.
 - (d) Upon production of a Bylaw Violation Notice issued pursuant to this section within thirty (30) days from the issue thereof, together with the payment of the fee as provided in subsection (f) to the Administrator of the Municipality, the person to whom the notice was issued shall not be liable for prosecution for the contravention in respect of which the notice was issued.
 - (e) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a person to whom a Bylaw Violation Notice has been issued pursuant to this section may exercise his

right to defend any charge of committing a contravention of any of the provisions of this Bylaw.


- (f) Every person who commits an offence against this bylaw is liable to a fine and penalty of not more than \$1,000.00 for an individual or \$5,000.00 for a corporation and not less than \$100.00 for each offence.

- 4. Form A, Bylaw Violation Notice, shall be attached hereto and form part of this Bylaw.
