

TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will \underline{NOT} be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;

2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;

- 3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
- 4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
- 5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
- 6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
- 7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
- 8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
- 9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
- 10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
- 11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
- 12. Propane tanks;
- 13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT. Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

The Hanley Town Council hosted a very successful Quad Rally in October that raised \$14,283.47 for the Fire Hall Project! We received an amazing amount of cash donations, door prize and silent auction items. Way to go Councillors!

The R.M. of Rosedale had some reserve funds available to donate \$50,000 to the project so that we could proceed with the connection to the Town's water and sewage mains, putting pipes in the ground and the concrete floor completed! Hanley Housing Authority

Hanley Housing Program

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

General Requirements for Housing

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

Review Process

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer are included in the rent.

Any questions related to the Hanley Housing Authority should first be directed to the manager.

All requested income information and previous landlord references must be included or application will not be processed.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our October Meeting:

As there were no attendees at the Public Hearing to adopt a bylaw amending the Zoning Bylaw, the amendment was adopted. This was the bylaw that provided for the inclusion of potential flood areas.

A bylaw was adopted to increase the water usage rates to \$22.50 per 1000 ig. This increase is very minimal as the DRWU was required to increase rates by 5.5% but the Town Council was able to review the preliminary 2018 water & sewer budget to find that with diligence in operations and the new distribution pumps the extra \$0.50 can be put aside for unexpected water main breaks or reserves. If there is a surplus to the water and sewer budget in any year, it is transferred into a reserve for future expenditures.

A Transfer Station Emergency Response Plan was adopted by the Council.

Utility arrears for one property were applied to the taxes of that property following notification to the owner.

Riverbend Co-op applied for the tax abatement program and was approved. This program encourages new business to build in the Town. The first year's municipal tax levy is abated 100%, 2nd year 80%, 3rd year 60%, 4th year 40%, 5th year 20%. The School taxes are not abated in this program.

The Administrator was authorized to proceed with tax enforcement following six months after tax liens were registered. The balance of taxes owing to the end of the current year on one property were cancelled and added to the tax enforcement record. This property was then to be offered for sale by tender. The tenders will be opened at the December 11/17 regular meeting.

The municipal insurance was renewed with changes for 2018.

It was noted that our Wastewater Operator is now required to conduct downstream sewage monitoring. He will proceed with monitoring by taking pictures during the period of time the lagoon is being released. The CAO to create a report for the Water Security Agency who will be forwarding the report to Environment Canada.

The Foreman also reminded Council that gravel is not applied to the roads due to dust control being applied to the high traffic areas. It will be applied to streets as needed as late in the fall as possible.

An alarm system was set up as part of the distribution pump project. This system will alert the water operator when there is any disruption at the plant.

Councillor McGregor has been attending the WaterWolf Executive meetings and reporting back to Council of the regional co-operation that the organization is providing for the Town.

The Administrator reported on the amount of water used at the Spray Park over the summer. The spray park used a total of 117,023 ig over the summer. This is a great place for children to spend the summer but parents please monitor your children so there is no unnecessary use of water. The Administrator also supplies the Council with a monthly water consumption report that compares the amount of water used to the amount of water billed. The water operator is happy with the % difference as there is unmetered water being used to flush in the Industrial Park and the water breaks are unmetered.

The Administrator attended a number of meetings and workshops over the month. She attended a Saskatchewan Waste Reduction Council workshop in Moose Jaw, a SUMA Regional Meeting in Davidson and a Munisoft workshop in Saskatoon. Ongoing education and networking is an important aspect of the position to keep abreast of legislation and what issues other municipalities may have.

At our November meeting:

Brian Sawatzky, President of Agvantage Development Corp attended the meeting by telephone. There were many issues discussed with questions and answers on both sides. The Council approved Agvantage pursuing vendors of a cannabis production facility in the Industrial Park.

Councillor McGregor recommended that we approve the 2018 WaterWolf budget as presented.

The MU1 & MU3 storm pond report conducted by SAL Engineering was presented and approved.

A bylaw to repeal bylaws was adopted.

The Councillors volunteering to be Fire Dept advisory committee was given approval to form a joint Fire Hall Committee with the RM of Rosedale Fire Dept representatives.

A Tax Enforcement administrative fee was waived as the online payment, that although was paid, was not received prior to the Administrator completing the 6-month notice.

Administrator holidays were approved for Nov. 20 to 23 with the Town Office to be closed Nov. 21 & 22.

The Administrator attended a couple more meetings/workshops. The Solid Waste Advisory Team met with Minister Dustin Duncan, Ministry of Environment in Regina. Advisory Services conducts noon webinars where general concerns of Administrators can be addressed and

PROPERTY TAXES DUE!

The Hanley Town Council created a policy to help deter property tax arrears making the ratepayer in arrears responsible for the extra costs of the time it takes for tax enforcement. Property taxes are in arrears if they are not paid by December 31 of the year in which they are levied. That means that on January 1 if they are not paid, they are in arrears and before the first meeting of Council in January the CAO will begin Tax Enforcement. The first step is to prepare a list of ands in arrears to present to the Council who approve the list and approve the advertising of that list. The ratepayer's name is not advertised but the legal description is. The Town advertises the list in the Davidson Leader and posts the list in the Town Office. The charges that are implemented are as follows and will be added to the tax arrears (along with advertising charges, the cost of the tax lien, title searches and the cost of registered mail):

Preparation of List to Council and Advertisement	\$20
Register Tax Lien	\$20
Six Months' Notice	\$120
Farm Debt Mediation Board Notice	\$20
Provincial Mediation Board Consent Request	\$50
Thirty Day Notice	\$50
Request to Registrar	\$50

As you can see above, it gets very expensive to let your taxes go into arrears. The Town Office recommends monthly payments being made starting in January for any current year taxes. You can compare the prior year amount, divide that by 12 and leave post-dated cheques at the Town Office or set up your on-line banking to have the money sent to the Town monthly. You will receive a 5% discount starting in January till the end of July. There is a 4% discount till the end of August, 3% till the end of September and 2% till the end of October. The current tax notices go out usually in May. If you need to make adjustments to your payments, you can do so at that time but also keep track of what you may have owing in the year. The Town sends out reminder letters in December that the end of the year is upon us and how much you still owe in taxes.

RULES RULES RULES!

For this edition's "Rules", you can learn about the Transfer Station and why we can't just "dump" our garbage at a landfill like we used to and just burn the garbage to get rid of it. This facility is regulated by the Province's Ministry of Environment. Pursuant to *The Municipal Refuse Management Regulations* an Approval to operate a transfer station is issued to the Town, subject to the Terms and Conditions of the Approval.

A transfer station, in a nutshell, means that anything that is left at the site must be "transferred" to another facility that can manage the waste, e.g. metals are chopped up and melted for other uses, the waste in the bins is managed in a large landfill where soil and water sampling and compaction are conducted, the "clean" wood/trees can be burned on-site.

Under the terms and conditions:

3.1 The Town must comply with *The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010*, the *Regulations*, all other applicable legislation, and the Terms and Conditions of the Approval to ensure proper maintenance and operation of the transfer station.

3.3 All aspects of maintenance and operation of the approved transfer station shall be conducted in such a manner as to minimize the impact to groundwater and surface water quality, air quality and on aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems. (This section is important due to findings of pollution from burning unknown substances. For example, when you have a petroleum spill or leaky fuel tanks, it is known what chemical is involved. In household garbage, the plastics, fibers, metals, etc are broken down with burning and the ash left behind is undefined chemicals).

3.6 Upon request of an Environmental Officer, the Town shall immediately provide any books, records, logs, graphs, files, papers, documents or data, including any information on computer, in digital or electronic format, maintained by or for the Town in relation to the transfer station. (This is achieved by the on-site operator asking you for your permit number, inspecting and recording what you have taken to the transfer station for disposal. The operator then provides the Town Office with those documents for review and keeping. An annual report is provided to the Town Council of the receipts and expenditures involved in the operations and maintenance of the transfer station).

Section 4 of the Approval speaks to the handling, concentration, accumulation and storage of waste at the site which includes what can be collected. The Town shall not cause or permit burning except as otherwise authorized meaning clean wood/trees which also has a number of regulations noted under section 4.12 and is under the legislation of *The Clean Air Act, The Prairie Forest Fire Act, 1982* and *The Dutch Elm Disease Regulations, 2005*.

Section 5 speaks to the supervision, security, inspections, monitoring and reporting requirements of the Approval.

Any alterations or closures that may be desired must first be approved by the ministry under sections 6 & 7.

A Transfer Station Emergency Response Plan was developed by the Town CAO and Transfer Station Operator Wayne Kraft. They are now working on an operations plan. These two documents are also required in the Approval.

The residents of the Town of Hanley and the RM of Rosedale have been so cognizant of the rules and regulations of the transfer station that the Town was invited to appoint a representative to sit on the province's Landfill Advisory Team (now changed to Solid Waste Advisory Team). This invitation came to the Town as, out of all the Transfer Stations in the province, only two were in complete compliance and we were one of them!






