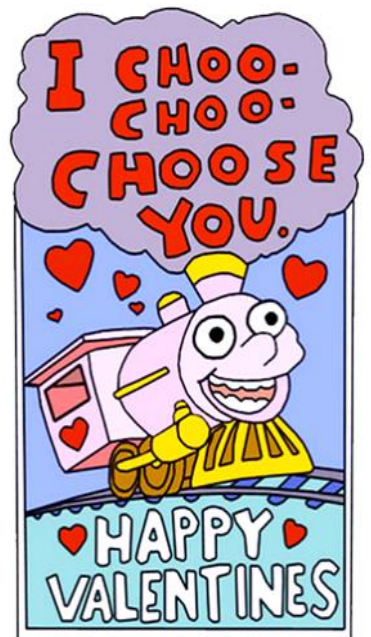

**TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION**

**NOTICE  
OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE  
TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION**

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **NOT** be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;
2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
12. Propane tanks;
13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)



There are designated areas for steel. ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT. Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

**ANIMAL CONTROL**

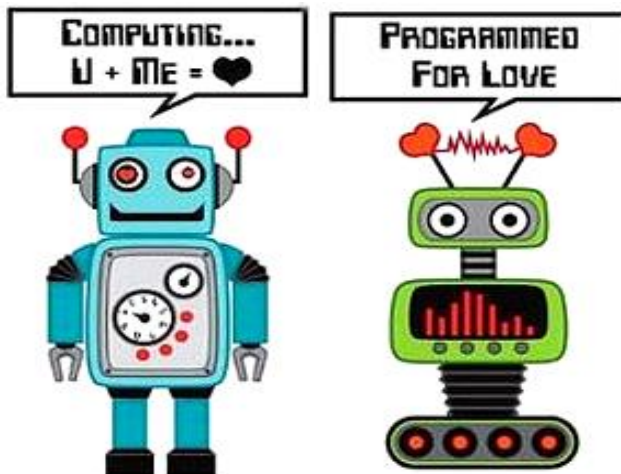
Did you remember to purchase your dog and/or cat licenses for 2017 prior to Feb. 1 for \$25 each animal?

Our bylaw states that "every owner of a cat or dog that is over 4 months old shall, within 30 days of becoming the owner, obtain a license for each cat or dog." The owner of the cat or dog shall ensure that the animal wears a collar to which the tag shall be attached whenever the animal is off the premises of the owner.

The licenses expire Dec. 31 of the year purchased. We are unable to identify microchips, therefore the tag is necessary but the microchip information must be provided to the Town Office prior to Feb. 1, along with the annual license fee.

Kennel permits for breeders are \$100 per year (Jan. 1 to Dec. 31) and also must be purchased prior to Feb. 1.

***NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE***

The Council and employees held their annual Christmas supper jointly with the RM of Rosedale. A delicious meal was catered by the Hanley United Church.

**At the December meeting of Council:**

Public Works Foreman, Bentley Collins, attended the meeting to give the Council an update on Public Works with a question and answer period. This is a good time for both parties to catch up with each other formally.

The Building Canada Fund – Clean Water and Wastewater Fund (CWWF); and Provincial Territorial Infrastructure Component (PTIC) are currently accepting applications so the Administrator was instructed to apply for the watermain and distribution pump replacement project to be applied for under the CWWF and the Fire Hall Building project under the PTIC.

A donation of \$100 was provided to the Hanley Hockey Day.

The Policy Manual was amended in regards to contractors being pre-approved and if not pre-approved, an application must be made to the Council with recommendation considered by the Public Works Foreman. The Foreman is aware of water and sewer contractors that are very capable and reliable for the installation of water and sewer lines so some contractors are pre-approved. If a contractor desires to do work in Town where the Foreman or Councillors are unaware of prior work experience, they or the homeowner must apply to the Town so that the Town can be assured that there will be no problems in the future.

Expenditures for the 2017 SUMA Convention were approved for one Councillor and the Administrator. Deputy Mayor Richard McGregor plans to attend again. This is a very beneficial event for Council and the Administrator with a number of educational units scheduled and networking opportunities with other municipalities or the Provincial representatives.

Unpaid custom work amounts were added to the tax roll.

Administrator holidays were approved for the period December 27, 2016 through to January 5, 2017. Due to these holidays, the next regular meeting was scheduled for January 16, 2017.

The Administrator was instructed to apply for the Canada Summer Jobs Initiative. This program, if approved, provides funding for the hiring of secondary or post-secondary summer students.

The Council signed a contract with Loraas Disposal for another year.

Tammy Goldthorpe-Martens resignation from Council was accepted. A By-election will be held on March 15, 2017 with the nomination day on February 8, 2017. Nomination forms are available at the Town Office or [www.townofhanley.ca](http://www.townofhanley.ca).

Two stale-dated cheques were voided and payment was re-issued for the Hanley Arena.

***NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE continued...*****At the January meeting:**

A water metering device was installed in October at the beginning of the private line at the southernmost end of First St. to assist in the reconciliation of water usage and billing. It was discovered that there is a difference in usage and billing so Council decided that the difference should be invoiced to the four users on that line.

The Mayor and Administrator signed the Auditor engagement letter to be returned to Vantage CPA's from North Battleford to engage their services for the 2016 audit. Jim Irvine, CA has been a great auditor to work with for a number of years and is very diligent in his duties.

A resolution amendment was made to correct names.

Employee wages were approved for 2017.

The list of lands in arrears of 2016 taxes was presented to Council. This list will now be advertised in the Davidson Leader.

Appointments were made for: Auditor (Vantage, CA's), Solicitor (Dellene Church), Local Assessor (Darice Carlson, CAO), Animal Control Officer (Jennifer East), WaterWolf Voting Delegate (Darice Carlson, CAO), EMO Coordinator (Cindy Hoffman), Board of Revision (WaterWolf District Board of Revision), Secretary to Board of Revision (WaterWolf Secretary), Parks & Rec (Andrea Townsend, Councillor), DRWU Board (Darice Carlson, CAO).

Councillors volunteered for Advisory Positions: Human Resources (Melissa Maddocks), Centennial Committee (Richard McGregor), Hanley Rosedale Fire Protection District Board (Dwight Thall, Giselle Hanson), Public Works & Water & Sewer (Dwight Thall, Andrea Townsend), Economic Development (Melissa Maddocks), Hanley Arena (Andrea Townsend), RCMP Elected Official (Richard McGregor), Community Consultative Group (Giselle Hanson), Hanley Library Board (Giselle Hanson), Hanley Agricultural Society (Andrea Townsend), Artificial Ice Committee (Andrea Townsend).

Preferred vendors were approved: Fuel – Trailbreak Services; Equipment Maintenance and repairs – Thall's Service; Small tools and supplies – Hanley Hardware.

The assessment appeal fee was set at \$300 per appeal. The Board of Revision members will be remunerated \$50 per appeal.

Utility arrears were reviewed and the Administrator was instructed to discontinue services for users with September arrears if payment arrangements were not made.

Deputy Mayor, Richard McGregor, was appointed as voting delegate for the 2017 SUMAssure Annual General Meeting.

2017 Camping rates were set and management of the campgrounds will be reviewed over the coming months: \$22 Daily Rate; \$125 Weekly Rate; \$450 Monthly Rate.

Because of new regulations by the SLGA, the Council approved the use of Town owned facilities to host events where there may be alcohol served.
