



#### *TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION* NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will <u>NOT</u> be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;

2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;

- 3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
- 4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
- 5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
- 6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
- 7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
- 8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
- 9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
- 10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
- 11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
- 12. Propane tanks;
- 13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT. Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

#### **Hanley Housing Authority**

#### **Hanley Housing Program**

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

#### **General Requirements for Housing**

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

#### **Review Process**

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer are included in the rent.

Any questions related to the Hanley Housing Authority should first be directed to the manager.

All requested income information and previous landlord references must be included or application will not be processed.



From 1914 to 1968 the Opera House was the most important structure in Hanley and occupied that position in the Town's history. In 1910 the Town Council decided to proceed jointly with the RM of Rosedale to build a Town Hall and Opera House. This brick structure was to be a statement of the permanence these pioneers felt for their little town of the vast prairie. By late 1912, the building was underway and on October 1, 1914 its doors opened for the first time.

#### NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

#### At our August Meeting:

Councillor Maddocks couldn't make it to the meeting as her new baby was keeping her busy.

A thank you was provided to Fire Chief Les Kroeger for assistance he provided to Water Operator Don Suttie during a power outage in the night while the regular operator was on holidays. Thanks Les!

Mayor Marv Gerbrandt was appointed to the WaterWolf Planning Commission as voting delegate. After review of original agreements, the new Executive discovered that Administrators or CAO's are ineligible.

Clerk, Charlene McClean is closing in on her three-month probationary period on the 18<sup>th</sup> of September so will be subject to a wage increase. Charlene has fit right in on the team of employees for the Town of Hanley.

A Policy was created to deal with shipping containers. They are meant to be used as temporary storage sites but are now required to have a valid building permit. Any container placed on a property in excess of 30 days will become taxable on the owner's property. The Council created a list of requirements for the containers that will be located in excess of 30 days. There are exemptions per property if a container is already on-site as of August 14, 2017. If you are considering a shipping container, please contact the Town Office.

The Administrator consumes a lot of time while working on the tax enforcement process. The Council adopted a tax enforcement fee schedule which was added to the Policy Manual. If your property becomes subject to Tax Enforcement, these fees will apply.

A request for Certificate of Completion for Wellington Crescent was received. Following inspection by the Mayor, Town Foreman and Administrator, a report was provided to the Council with a list of deficiencies which was forwarded to Providence Grain Group Inc.

Utility users in arrears of over 90 days were to have their water service disconnected Wednesday, August 16/17.

The Administrator will attend a Munisoft Refresher Seminar on September 29 and reported to Council about the July 11 Solid Waste Advisory Team meeting. She was unable to attend the Annual DRWU summer tour.

The Council learned that after a great number of years, Cindy Hoffman will no longer be sitting on the Community Consultative Group. Thanks for your many years of dedication to this group and the issues in the region that you have dealt with over the years. If anyone in the community is interested in sitting on this committee, please contact the Town Office or Cindy can provide you with information as to what they do.

The Council reviewed correspondence informing them that the Insurance Policy and Group Benefits Insurance will be subject to the 6% PST so can expect an increase in fees for 2018.

#### At our September meeting:

Clerk McClean met the terms of her probation so Council decided that her wage increase was to commence Sept. 18 and Group Benefits begin.

The introduction and first reading of an amendment to the Zoning Bylaw to provide for the identification of flood hazard throughout the Town was moved and carried. Public Notice is to be provided with the public hearing to be held at 7:00 p.m., Oct. 10/17 in the Town Council chambers.

A property was declared a nuisance with appeal date set for Oct. 6/17.

Due to Thanksgiving being the same date as the regular Council Meeting, the next regular meeting will be conducted on Tuesday, Oct. 10/17.

Water and sewer connection applications were received and approved.

A Town bunnyhug will be donated to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Quad Rally being planned by the Council as a fundraiser for the Fire Hall.

The Waterworks Emergency Plan was accepted as amended.

As Kianna Dietz, our summer student, was certified on the town mower, the Council approved the use of the mower to cut areas of the fairgrounds with the Ag Society indemnifying Ms. Dietz.

Approval was given to the Administrator to proceed with title acquisition by apply to the registrar to transfer the titles through the tax enforcement process.

After waiting a number of months for the Permit to Construct, Anderson Pump House began the change-over construction of the water distribution pumps on September 11. This process was completed within the week and we now have brand new 7.5hp VFD pumps with stainless steel piping and new alarm systems in place. We will get the water plant cleaned up and painted on the inside and are waiting on the contractor for the external siding.

The south end of First St. was re-opened but a reminder to drivers that this is still not an all-weather road so if wet, the Town will not be responsible if a driver gets stuck.

A new Fire Hall construction committee was formed with the members of the Hanley/Rosedale Fire Protection District Board which currently consists of three RM and three Town Council members. A meeting was held with Titanium Heating and Cooling after finally receiving the mechanical plan and the committee decided to contract Titanium for the mechanical portion of construction. It had already been decided that Strive Concrete should do the floor including in-floor heating pipes and Rosedale Electric has been provided with the electrical plan. By the time this issue goes to print, you will have seem some of this next phase of construction taking place.

#### **RULES RULES RULES!**

It seems the Town has rules for everything and sometimes they don't make sense! Why do we have so many rules? Over the next few issues of the Hermes, we will try to explain some of the rules by which the Hanley Town Council have to abide by. Quite often, community members think that the Councils have power to do whatever they wish in their community but there are regulations that must be followed that are legislated by the Province or Federal Government.

All municipalities (including the Town of Hanley and the RM of Rosedale) are legislated mainly by The Municipalities Act although there are a number of other Acts that the Councils must abide by.

In September, Hanley experienced a town-wide Precautionary Drinking Water Advisory while the distribution pumps/ motors & piping was being upgraded. The Town requires a permit issued by the Water Security Agency to distribute water. This permit is issued under the guidelines of *The Water Regulations*, 2002. Anytime these regulations refer to "the Minister", that position is filled with Environmental Project Officers that are employed by the Water Security Agency to ensure that water providers are not contravening any of the regulations as set by "the Minister".

Some of the following sections apply to the Town of Hanley:

- Sections 27 & 28: These sections apply to reservoirs used to store water and the pump houses intended or used for human consumptive use or hygienic use.
- Sections 32, 33 and 34 speak to the requirements of daily water sampling to ensure that chlorine and turbidity levels are maintained to a standard that meets the Chemical – Health Category Parameter and the standards set out in the permit to operate.
- Section 35 requires an independent engineering assessment every 5 years (which we have completed 3 times since this requirement came into force) for a cost of around \$4000 each time.
- Division 6 speaks to the requirements of water testing by an accredited laboratory. The Town must send in bacteriological tests once a week (at a cost of \$21/week not including postage), Halo-Acetic Acid tests once every 6 months during January and July of each year at a cost of \$204.75 each, and Trihalomethane tests once every three months at a cost of \$76.90 each (not including postage). The bacteriological testing must also be done in the event of a disruption in service (two samples from two different locations for two days to total 4 samples).
- Section 42 requires operational records to be kept so the Town's water operator also has bookkeeping on a daily basis with reports sent in at the end of the year to the Water Security Agency. The daily records must be initialed by the Mayor/Deputy Mayor once a month. Once per year an annual notice must be sent to consumers of the water so a notice is distributed with your March utility billing that records are posted on the bulletin board at the Town Office.
- Part VI speaks to certification of the water operator. Both of our water operators have their level 2 certification and to maintain this certification must take workshops and attend events to obtain Continuing Education Units (CEU's).



1200 SHIPPING CONTAINERS WITHIN THE TOWN BOUNDARIES

Date of resolution and coming into force: August 14, 2017

#### PURPOSE

This policy is intended to enable the Town of Hanley (municipality) to regulate the placement of shipping containers located within the Town of Hanley and be used in conjunction with the Town of Hanley Bylaw No. 4/11, the "Building Bylaw".

#### **DEFINITION**

Shipping containers are defined as reusable transport and storage units specifically constructed for the transport of goods by rail, ship or transport truck. Shipping container may also take the form of the body of a transport trailer, body of a straight truck, or prefabricated metal storage units.

#### REGULATIONS

Shipping containers are meant to be used as temporary storage sites, usually utilized for storage of supplies during a construction period. All storage containers as such must have a valid building permit. Any container placed on a property in excess of thirty (30) days will become taxable on the owner's property assessment. Only one container will be allowed per property.

When the shipping container will be located on the property in excess of 30 days, the shipping container shall:

Not be placed on a public right-of-way or dedicated lands;

Not to be placed in a front yard;

Be located a minimum of 1.5 metres from a side property line;

Be located a minimum of 1.2 metres from back alley property line;

Be located so as not to create a safety hazard or block traffic site lines;

Be painted a similar colour as the residence and kept in good condition as to not be deemed unsightly;

Not be placed until an approved Building Permit is obtained.

This policy is subject to changes and amendments when required.
