

TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will <u>NOT</u> be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;

2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;

- 3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
- 4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
- 5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
- 6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
- 7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
- 8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
- 9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
- 10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
- 11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
- 12. Propane tanks;
- 13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT. Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

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Hanley Housing Authority

Hanley Housing Program

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

General Requirements for Housing

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

Review Process

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer are included in the rent.

Any questions related to the Hanley Housing Authority should first be directed to the manager.

All requested income information and previous landlord references must be included or application will not be processed.



TIDBITS

Did you know, there are at least 3 defibrillators in the community. These being situated in the Community Center, Arena and with the First Responders.

At our April Meeting:

Public Works Foreman, Ben Collins attended the meeting to report and receive updates and concerns from the Council.

After our RCMP report, the Council decided they were in agreement with the Policing Priorities for the Saskatoon Detachment. These priorities are:

Community Safety Through Crime Reduction (Rural Crime)

(1) Enforcement – Prolific Offenders – Property Related Crim; Drugs; Traffic

(2) Visibility – Rural Patrols, School and Community Visits and Presentations

(3) Intelligence Lead – Intel Gathering; Rural Crime Watch Groups etc.

A Railway Crossing Maintenance Agreement was finalized, signed and forwarded to Agvantage Development Corp for signatures.

The Council discussed the use of e-transfers to accept payment of utilities or taxes. The Town auditor wasn't sure if it was a secure way for people to pay the Town but feedback from payees appreciate the use of e-transfers as there are a couple banks that the Town couldn't get set up with for online banking. A Policy was drafted but Council decided to continue with accepting e-transfers the way the office has been but encourage payees to stay on top of payments they have made to the Town to ensure the payments are being directed accordingly.

Water utility users in arrears were to have the service discontinued if not paid by April 13/18. The Council want to remind water users that if the utility invoices are unpaid 30 days after the billing date, that they will incur a 2% penalty starting July 1/18. Hopefully this will encourage monthly payments or on-time payments so the office staff is not having to continually remind people to pay.

The Summer Student advertisement posters went up throughout the Town. The Council will be hiring at the May meeting.

It was decided to celebrate Emergency Measures Week again this year with a draw for a case of water bottles. Anyone that has registered and living in the Town of Hanley will be eligible for the draw to be made on May 11. The EMO Coordinator has arranged a team meeting with an Emergency Services Officer that will be held in May. The EMO Coordinator attended a WaterWolf members meeting where Emergency Planning was discussed. She reported that the Fire Commissioner's Office knows about our Fire Hall project and they are happy with how we are building it and look forward to having training sessions here for the region.

The Animal Control Officer decided to resign but luckily Suzanne Coghill applied and was accepted under the contract agreement as per

RULES RULES RULES!

The Town Office frequently receives the following question: "Why doesn't the Town just go clean up that yard and charge the owner?"

Good question! The answer you would get is that we would be trespassing on private property if we just sent a crew in to clean-up. The Province has provided us with a legal means to proceed with nuisance yards. *The Municipalities Act* provides municipalities with the authority to pass a Nuisance Abatement Bylaw ("the Bylaw"). Please refer to our March Issue of the Hermes.

The Town Office also has received many concerns in regards to heavy traffic within the residential side of the Town limits:

Weight Restrictions and "Truck Route"

The Town of Hanley has a bylaw that restricts the weight of vehicles on Lincoln St. to 8,000 kg. Otherwise, the weight restriction throughout Town is 35 tonnes except for Duncan Rd, Wellington Cres, Wall St., Bond St. and the 764 grid where the weights can be over 35 tonnes for services within the Industrial Park. Other exceptions to the weight restriction are: Loraas Disposal supplying services to the 200 & 300 Block of Lincoln St.; emergency vehicles; and, residential delivery vehicles supplying services to the 200 & 300 Block of Lincoln. The Council has designated a "truck route" to suggest that the heavier vehicles (over 8 T and under 35 T) take this route to contain them to a smaller area but currently, the Town's traffic bylaw allows vehicles under 35 T on any street within the Town limits. The containment of heavier vehicles on the "truck route" helps with more maintenance of those streets and hopefully, less on the rest of the streets.



2018 Taxes for the Town of Hanley:

The Council for the Town of Hanley started a 3-year program starting in 2017 to get the minimum taxes to a level that is more closely reflected in other communities in our area.

In **2017**, the minimum tax for empty residential land was increased from \$53.50 in 2016 to \$106 and land with improvements from \$572.89 in 2016 to \$700. Commercial minimum tax for empty land was increased from \$53.50 in 2016 to \$159.00 and land with improvements from \$\$678.98 to \$800.

For **2018**, the Council will be changing the Commercial mill rate factor to 1.28 with the minimum for empty land set at \$262.35, and land with improvements \$920. The residential minimum tax for empty land will be \$174.90, and for land with improvements \$805.

The comparisons that were done with other smaller communities ranged from \$175 to \$850 for empty residential land and \$800 to \$1200 for residential land with improvements. No concession for empty commercial land was provided for these communities but their commercial land with improvements ranged from \$800 to \$1200.
