

### **Hanley Housing Authority**

### **Hanley Housing Program**

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

### **General Requirements for Housing**

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

### **Review Process**

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer are included in the rent.

Any questions related to the Hanley Housing Authority should first be directed to the manager.

All requested income information and previous landlord references must be included or application will not be processed.



### Hanley Arena News

Hi everyone, this has been a long time coming, so please bear with us while we catch you all up.

We'd like to start off by extending a welcome to the cold! We are so excited for the upcoming season which wouldn't be possible without Mother Nature and her frigid temperatures! A huge thank you goes out to all of the ice angels who are working hard to get things going for the 2018/2019 seasons. Not only are they harrowing ground beforehand to get it ready for floods, then spending many late nights putting the floods on, but also helping with the water heater install, electrical upgrades, the grunt work of getting things in order for the upcoming season and so much more. We couldn't possibly start to name them for fear of leaving someone out. These angels never need to be asked to get things going, but rather take the initiative and volunteer hours of their time so that our community has a rink to enjoy for the winter months. If you see any of these guys out and about, be sure to give them a pat on the back. Thanks again crew!!

We are also excited to announce that the Arena board has some new members: Ryan Grindheim (Vice President), Julie Bessey (Treasurer), Trent Hammond, Kalli Crawford, and Sean Bursaw (Members at Large). We welcome back Trish Anderson as the President and Mel Chasmar as the Secretary. Thank you to the members for joining our team and volunteering their time, effort, and ideas to keep the rink running smoothly for this next season!

More exciting news for the Arena.....Once the ice is established, the floods are now a one-man job!! A huge thank-you goes out to Dallas Torguson and Dean Anderson for manufacturing and fabricating a brush set-up onto the tractor. We can officially get rid of the board brooms as the system is automatic now while the tractor is flooding!!

We'd like to extend a round of 'thanks 'to the Hanley Ag Fair Committee for their generous donations over the years. Recently they helped to fund our new sound system. It's so exciting to match our events with music, as it changes the atmosphere completely!! Another community member deserving of praise is Betty Lynn Peek. Thank you very much Betty Lynn for the funds you have raised for the arena over the years. We appreciate it!

As you've maybe noticed, there are some upgrades happening at the rink these days. We are proud to let you know, that at the Calcutta last April, we raised a very much-needed \$18,000.00. Thank you so much to everyone who contributed in any way. We simply couldn't keep the rink doors open without your support. This money has been put towards the following upgrades:

New lighting in the lobby area (\$1,700)

New Water Heater system in the Tractor room (\$8,000)

New doors in the rink area (\$6,600)

Unfortunately the rink has recently experienced a break-in, which means that the remaining money will have to go towards repairing/replacing interior doors and locks, as well as a security system and cameras. If you have any information on this crime, please let us know. A report has been filed with the RCMP, but we also rely on the eyes and ears of our locals in situations like these.

In addition to the lobby lights, we will also need to replace the light fixtures in other areas of our rink including the storage room, dressing rooms, furnace room etc. The existing systems are being phased out, and soon it will be difficult to find replacement bulbs.

I'm sure many of you have heard about and/or noticed the amassed decay in the rinks foundation. It is particularly bad at the south end of the arena. What we initially thought could be a quick fix has been confirmed as 'major' structural issues. The commercial estimate for repair came in at \$150,000.00. We are hoping that with our local construction expertise and amazing volunteers that we can get that number down substantially. Please stay tuned for updates and ways that you can help. This one really will 'take a village'!

On to some good news!! This year we will have three Hanley minor hockey teams to keep our rink busy. The little guys (initiation) will play exhibition games with other teams in our surrounding area, while the Novice and Atom teams are playing in the Fertile Valley Hockey League. Each teams schedule has been added onto the arena calendar located on the town's website (www.townofhanley.ca). You can also find the league stats and more by visiting www.fvhl.org. Each teams home game schedule and roster has been attached below. Please watch the town website for any changes. It's a known fact that athletes plays better with an audience, so please come out and show the kids your support! It's so nice to have hockey booming in Hanley again!

The Arena kitchen will be up and running again this year. We will run in the same format as last year. Each minor hockey player 's family will have to captain a set number of shifts. That means they will be responsible to fill each of their designated shifts with a total of 4 people. The booth will be open for all games and tournaments and the sign up sheet will come out in December. If you or someone you know is interested in volunteering in the kitchen, please let a minor hockey player, or an arena board member know!

The public skating schedule will also be added to the calendar on the towns' website. It will be finalized closer to opening day, so please check back for ice times and changes. The public skating fees will remain the same as last year. The family rate is \$75 and for a single skater \$40. Payment is accepted via cheque (payable to Hanley Arena, Box 247) or e-transfer (arenahanley@gmail.com).

**NEW YEARS!!!!** We have decided to host a New Years Eve party! It will be an all ages event with skating, shinny, food, drink, music, a countdown to midnight and more! 

#### **RULES RULES RULES!**

Why do we have to apply for a Building Permit?

The answer to this question is covered under the *Uniform Building and Accessibility Standards Act.* Section 4 states: "4(1) Subject to the other provisions of this section, each local authority shall administer and enforce this Ace, the regulations and orders and decisions of the appeal board pursuant to sections 12 & 18." "Appropriate local authority" means the local authority that has jurisdiction over the geographical area in which a building is or is to be situated. If you are building in the Town of Hanley, the Town of Hanley is the local authority.

Sections 5 & 5.1 of this Act talks about the Building Official where the Building Official must be authorized by the minister and appointed by the local authority. The Town of Hanley has appointed Meridan Inspections as the Building Official. There is a difference between a Building Official and a Building Inspector. A Building Official is licensed under the province and an Inspector may be as simple as a home inspector with no qualifications and does not necessarily include all components of the National Building Code.

Section 7(1) states that: "the owner of each building in Saskatchewan shall ensure that the building is designed, constructed, erected, placed, altered, repaired, renovated, demolished, relocated, removed, used or occupied in accordance with the building standards." There are exceptions to this which include a building in which construction commenced or completed prior to this Act coming into force (1988); a building on which a building permit was issued prior to the coming into force of this section; a farm building (unless the RM passes a resolution station that the standards should apply); and any building or class of buildings exempted in the regulations.

Section 14 allows the local authority to make bylaws with respect to the regulations. These bylaws must be approved by the "Minister" so the bylaws are strictly enforced by the province in how they are written. The permit supplied by the local authority does not authorize any person to construct a building that does not comply with the provisions of any other Act or law.

To ensure compliance with the provisions of this Act, the Building Official has been given authority listed under section 16 and if the standards are being contravened, section 17 authorizes the Official to make written "orders".

- The Town of Hanley's building permit process includes:
  - An application for a Development Permit including a site plan this ensures that the construction is compliant with the Town's Zoning Bylaw;
  - An application for a Building Permit which includes detailed plans for the construction;
  - If a new build: an application for water and sewer services which includes a payment of \$4600 being the standard cost to help pay for the water pipeline from Dundurn Rural Water Utility and future infrastructure needs of the Town;
  - The site plan and complete building permit application is emailed to Meridan Inspections for a plan review;
  - Meridan will complete the review and either instruct the Town Administrator to approve the permit or reject the application. He will provide an invoice that includes the cost of construction and his charges for the permit;
  - The Town will invoice the applicant the amount provided by Meridan including a \$50 administrative charge and a \$15 charge for the development permit application (residential);
  - On receipt of the payment by the applicant, the Administrator will provide the permits to the applicant along with the plan review; The applicant will need to follow up with Meridan for periodic inspections as stated on each of the review and inspection reports. The inspection reports are forwarded to the Town and the Administrator will keep a copy on file and provide a copy to the applicant;
  - On completion of the construction, Meridan will provide a "final inspection report" which is forwarded to the applicant and two copies are kept on file in the Town Office as per the address in which the permit was awarded and the year in which the permit was approved. The Office also keeps an electronic file of all the information gathered during the process.

You may view the bylaws of the Town along with the "Building Bylaw" and its amendments at the Town Office or on the website <u>www.townofhanley.ca</u> under "Administration" and "Bylaws and Policy".

If you are applying for a Building Permit, you may obtain the information from the Town's website but it may be more beneficial to go to the Town Office to receive a package that has all the information you may require to help you make the application process smoother.

### At our October Meeting:

Foreman Ben Collins' report included:

Having received the new permit to operate a sewage works;

Follow-up from the reservoir cleaning.

Administrator Darice Carlson reported on:

New services agreement with Multi-Material Stewardship Western;

Met with Clayton Drewlo of Urban Systems in regards to the process to develop a walking trail;

Having attended the DRWU regular meeting Sept. 26 where the 2019 budget was passed with a 5% increase to the charge for water usage.

The Council decided to sell the GPS as we will be getting our assets mapped through a project with other WaterWolf member communities in 2019.

A water and sewer connection application was approved.

After a delegation from the Hanley Arena attended the meeting to discuss future plans the Council decided to inquire whether the Arena and Curling Club committees would wish to consider that the Town pay for power, energy and major purchases and invoice the committees less the GST hopefully saving those facilities some money. A bylaw to repeal bylaws was adopted.

One property with utility arrears had those arrears applied to the tax roll.

The SUMAssure renewal documents were reviewed with some changes.

A subdivision application was received and approval to be recommended to Community Planning with some considerations to be taken in regards to amending the Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws, and the municipal reserve to be negotiated.

An expense voucher was implemented to be attached to the Policy Manual.

The next regular Council meeting is to be held Nov. 13 due to Nov. 12 being a statutory holiday.

A resolution for tax enforcement to proceed was adopted.

Correspondence from Agvantage Development was reviewed and a reply drafted.

CAO holidays were approved for Dec. 24 and the Town Office will be closed that day.

The Council acknowledged that Don Suttie has been working for the Town for 40 years as a Water Operator!

### At our November meeting:

Each Councilor updated and signed their Public Disclosure Annual Declarations. Foreman Ben Collins' report included:

Someone dumped leaves in the drainage channel by E & D Motors (see "Tidbits");

The acute lethality test, or Trout test, was sent to a Calgary lab for testing during the initial period of lagoon discharge and an additional test has been sent following the lagoon drainage;

Administrator Darice Carlson reported:

Having attended an Employment Standards Webinar Oct. 17 and a Cybersecurity webinar Nov. 16; Attended a DRWU Policy Committee meeting on Oct. 22, the DRWU regular meeting on Oct. 24 and a Building Committee meeting on Oct. 29.

It was noted that SaskPower has the power connected to the Fire Hall.

Bylaws to introduce amendments to the Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws were introduced and read a first time.

Junked vehicles throughout the community were noted with instruction to the Administrator to send letters to property owners/occupants to remove all junked vehicles.

The water rates were reviewed following the noted increase from DRWU.

The Town received the video from the reservoir cleaning. It is quite fascinating to watch!

ACME Environmental offered an updated quote to Council to do a full-block lining rather than sectional spot repair on the sewer main between the two manholes extending from Third Ave towards the lagoon.

It is the Town's turn to host the joint Council Christmas Party. This is planned for December 1.

Due to space limitations from the construction of the new Fire Hall, the Administrator has been instructed to solicit Access Communications for rent on the property where their tower and building are located.

The Town has accommodated the Artificial Ice Committee for the use of the Moneris equipment so approval was given for the Administrator to pay the Committee the funds they have deposited with the Town at such time as they have completed the sale of the 2018-2019 Trip of the Month tickets.

Over the next couple of months, the Human Resources committee will be looking at employee wages. Registration for the 2019 SUMA Convention is open.
