

RULES RULES RULES

The Town could pass bylaws in regards to Traffic Safety but they would then need to provide enforcement so the Council has decided to leave enforcement up to the Province who provides enforcement for Traffic Safety through the RCMP and the *Traffic Safety Act*. The Council has only passed a bylaw that allows for: "all terrain vehicles shall be permitted to operate on the travelled portion of the whole or any part of a roadway within the Town of Hanley subject to the following condition: the operator is in the act of taking the most direct route to or from his point of origin or destination within the Town of Hanley to or from the Town of Hanley corporate limits"; "must have a valid driver's licence" and "the owner of said all terrain vehicle must have insurance on the all terrain vehicle".

Some of the general provisions of *The Traffic Safety Act* include a section where a driver's licence is required to drive a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is defined as "a vehicle propelled or driven by any means other than by muscular power". Under this section the legislation says that "no person under the age of 16 years shall operate a vehicle on a highway" (which means any street in town) unless authorized under *The All Terrain Vehicles Act; The Snowmobile Act;* any prescribed regulations or if they have a learner's licence and are accompanied and supervised by another person who meets the prescribed qualifications.

The All Terrain Vehicles Act states that "no person under the age of 16 years shall operate an all terrain vehicle" and "no person shall operate an all terrain vehicle unless he holds a subsisting driver's licence".

The Snowmobile Act gives a little more leeway stating that a person "12 years of ager or older but less that 16 years of age and has completed a safety course if that person is: accompanied on the snowmobile by another person who holds a class 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 driver's licence; or is accompanied and supervised by another person who holds a class 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 driver's licence and is operating another snowmobile".

Please be a **responsible** pet owner and keep your pets licensed, under control and cleaned up after!

The Fairgrounds is NOT a designated spot to let your pets poop! You may let them be off-leash within the gymkhana area but the rest of the grounds are used for many activities that involve people walking around. It's pretty nasty if they are walking in the poo you let your pet leave behind. We hosted Provincial Baseball at the end of July and the committee noticed an extreme amount of dog leavings and observed dogs within the BBQ shack. Please remember to be responsible and pick up after your pets!

Hanley Housing Authority

Hanley Housing Program

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

General Requirements for Housing

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

Review Process

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer are included in the rent.

Any questions related to the Hanley Housing Authority should first be directed to the manager.

All requested income information and previous landlord references must be included or application will not be processed.



NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our August meeting:

It was approved that Foreman, Ben Collins attend the Western Canada Snow Conference in Saskatoon in September.

The cost of Industrial Park signage will be shared four ways that will indicate for Industrial Park traffic to use the 764 grid.

A copy of a letter drafted by Judy Harwood, Reeve for the RM of Corman Park No. 344 was to be forwarded to the Ministry of Justice.

A new Transfer Station Operating Permit was presented to Council.

The Council recognized the equipment that CSI Pipeline had been using for landscaping around the new fire hall and recommend that the Fire Hall committee remunerate for fuel and equipment.

A bylaw to amend the Zoning Bylaw to incorporate Dance Studios was given first reading.

The Administrator was instructed to order 2 solar security cameras for the campground washroom building.

Correspondence was noted from SUMA that there would be an increase in RCMP fees for 2018. The Administrator was instructed to forward a letter to the Ministry of Justice recommending that they notify municipalities of potential increases prior to annual budget periods.

September, 2018 was declared Prostate Cancer Awareness Month.

A new memorandum of agreement was signed with the RM of Rosedale No. 283 respecting funding of the skating rink.

The Waterworks Rate Policy was amended to reflect the 2018 water rates.

The Administrator was instructed to submit an Infrastructure Investment Plan for sidewalks for 2018 in the amount of \$21,000. If a contractor can be hired this fall, hopefully the project will proceed.

After inspection, it was noted that a couple households had swimming pools that may be in contravention of the "Swimming Pool Bylaw" so the Administrator was instructed to forward a letter to these households to remind them of swimming pool regulations.

The insurance premiums for the curling club and arena were waived for 2018.

Retroactive approval was given to approve the receipt of donations to the Provincial Ball Committee with periodic payments to the committee.

CAO holidays were approved for Aug. 20/18.

The Mayor, Foreman and Administrator attended an on-site meeting with Texcana and Boyd Construction to inspect Bond St., Wall St., & Duncan Rd. The deficiencies for the MU1 were also reviewed.

The Administrator has contacted SAL Engineering for an opinion of probable cost for a new lift station.

The Administrator, and DRWU representative, reported having attended the annual DRWU tour. There was a visit to a water fill station in the RM of Corman Park and there was a tour of the Saskatchewan Research Council. This is where some water samples for the Town and all of the DWRU samples are tested.

The Fire Hall committee planned to meet on Aug. 15 to talk about electrical, insulation and tin on the walls & ceiling.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE—Cont'd

At our September meeting:

There were no attendees for the public hearing to adopt a bylaw amending the Zoning bylaw so the second and third readings were adopted and the bylaw amended to include a Dance Studio to be allowed as a discretionary use on Lots 15-18, Block 2, Plan H1032.

The policy for construction containers was reviewed again to include an agreement that must be signed between the person requesting the container and the Town; and a daily charge of \$10 will now be implemented.

The policy for shipping containers was amended to allow the shipping containers located in C2 – Highway Commercial for resale or temporary storage do not require a building permit.

As the sidewalk contractor is unable to fit us in this fall, funds were allocated to a prepaid expense account to be used for the project next spring.

There were a number of residents with utility arrears that will have the water service disconnected Sept. 18/18 unless payment is received in full by then.

Due to Oct. 8/18 being a stat holiday, the next regular Council meeting will be held Monday, Oct. 15/18.

CAO holidays were approved for Nov. 19-23/18 with the Town Office being closed on Nov. 23/18.

A Town bunnyhug was provided as a donation to the 3rd Annual Quad Rally being held Oct. 13/18.

An offer to purchase was received for Lots 7-8, Block 6, Plan H1032 and accepted with conditions. The CAO reported having had a WCB audit completed. She also reported on the DRWU Board regular meeting Aug. 22/18.

The Mayor, Foreman and CAO met with Texcana and Boyd Construction in regards to discrepancies in the Industrial Park roads and storm ponds.

A Proposal for a Pre-design report for the lift station was reviewed.

The spray park is being winterized the week of Sep. 10 by the caretaker and Town Foreman.

We have raised more funds and received some generous donations so Vern Harder has fixed the siding, fascia and doors and will be moving inside to insulate & frame the interior walls. Ryan from Rosedale Electric will be getting power inside the building before winter.

The Town Councillors have hosted a number of successful fundraisers that have raised \$60,376.49!

For 2015 and 2016 the Town Council budgeted \$13,500 tax dollars each year to total \$27,000.

The Town Administrator has applied for any grants she's been able to find or has been suggested and were approved for \$84,938.18.

The Town has provided charitable donation receipts from memorials and walk-ins in the amount of \$37,596.87.

In-kind contributions from the Town (no money was provided to the project but was important work outside the scope of daily duties) have totaled \$3,571. You will see that a lot of time goes into grant applications and not all have been approved; and considerable time is taken to ensure donations are gratefully received with "big cheque" presentations.

The project has received large donations from organizations or companies in the amount of \$95,845.30. Notable donations were from the Hanley Legion when they disbanded and Darren Grindheim asked Richardson Pioneer if they had any funding available. Other donations in this section have been fundraisers specifically for the Fire Hall Project.

In 2017, the RM of Rosedale donated \$50,000 so the floor could be finished.

Thank you to the Library Lemonade stand kids for raising \$162 towards the Fire Hall project on July 20!
