Hanley Housing Authority

Hanley Housing Program

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

General Requirements for Housing

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

Review Process

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer are included in the rent.

Any questions related to the Hanley Housing Authority should first be directed to the manager.

All requested income information and previous landlord references must be included or application will not be processed.

TOWN TIDBITS: Did vou know:

That at a rail crossing, the crossbucks have reflectors on the front and back? So, if you are coming up to a rail crossing with crossbucks in the dark and your lights reflect on the right side but you can't see the ones on the left (the back side of the other side of the tracks), then there is likely a train going across that crossing and you should stop.

The staff at the Dundurn Rural Water Utility did a study of the average daily consumption of subscribers which can certainly be a guide for the Town of Hanley water users. They found that:

- 2 in a Household use about 72.8 gallons of water per day;
- 4 in a Household use about 114.1 gallons per day;
- 6 or more in a Household use about 175.4 gallons per day.

It seems that people in Town have forgotten the lessons learned when taking their driver's license testing. For example: parking incorrectly on either parallel or angle parking streets (angle park on parallel parking streets and backing into an angle parking street or just the wrong way on a parallel parking street), backing out of a parking spot the wrong way, and speeding to name a few traffic infractions.

CHANGES COMING TO THE HERMES!

In 2018 the Town of Hanley committed \$4,176 to the production of the Hermes. This includes \$1,135 in revenue from businesses advertising which we would like to strongly encourage!

Because of increasing costs of postage and printing, the Council for the Town of Hanley have decided to make the following changes after this edition:

1) Volunteer organizations have had full page advertising with colour for free so going forward the local organizations will have half page ads in black & white;

2) All of the pages will be in black & white unless we can fit you in on the front or back page;

3) If you have opted to NOT receive flyers in your mail box, you will NOT receive a newsletter. Extra newsletters will be available in the hallway outside the Town Office.

In order to show the costs of publishing the Hermes, the Town Office staff have calculated expenses for 2018 taking into consideration that we take 400 copies of the newsletter to the post office:

- Colour copies totalled 33,600 copies at a cost of \$3,733;
- Black & white copies totalled 16,000 copies at a cost of \$276.80;
- Postage totalled \$439.20;
- Office Assistant wages to publish totalled \$672.00 if you consider it taking one full-day of wages (sometimes it is more!);
- Paper costs about \$190.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our February Meeting:

Councillor's McGregor reported on a member letter to update Council on work that WaterWolf is doing for our community and region.

The CAO reported on having attended the 2019 SUMA Convention.

She also reported that there are new Energy Code requirements that will affect Building Permit applications.

Vantage, CPA's came Feb. 14 to conduct the annual audit.

Councillor McGregor reported having attended the quarterly RCMP meeting on Jan. 9/19.

The Crime Watch committee reported that they are moving forward and signs will be ordered and erected throughout the Town.

A lot is to be transferred as the terms of the purchase agreement were fulfilled.

Administrator holidays were approved for Feb. 19 to March 1 with the office being closed on the two Fridays.

A utility surplus is to be transferred to the utility reserve. This is a requirement of the Saskatchewan Municipal Board.

As CN Rail is going to be putting stop signs on the crossbucks of the crossing on the 764 Grid, they requested that the Town erect a "Stop Ahead" sign on the "Crossing Ahead" sign post. This was approved.

The Administrator was instructed to apply for the Provincial Traffic Safety Fund for speed management to purchase 3 additional radar speed signs.

A Town bunnyhug was donated to the Fire Hall Fundraiser Ladies Night that some of the Councillor's are putting on.

At our March Meeting:

Public Works Foreman, Ben Collins, attended the meeting to discuss quotes received for the upgrades to the Lift Station. TSL Mechanical quote was approved.

A credit application was approved for EMCO Waterworks Corporation so they will be inspecting all the fire hydrants.

Water plant heater quotes were discussed with Lakeview Heating quote approved.

The Administrator reported:

- having attended a day long Asset Management workshop. A few amendments to the plan and 20-year forecast were approved.

- she was invited to attend a SUMA re-branding meeting on Friday, March 8.

- she was unable to attend the February DRWU meeting

Correspondence from the President of Agvantage Development was discussed to be followed up with a meeting with this developer.

The Fire Board committee reported on the meeting held Feb. 15. Vern Harder has returned to the area so he will begin work insulating the inside of the Fire Hall and applying tin to the ceiling.

The Ladies Night brought in \$2613 for the Fire Hall! Good work Council!
