TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION

NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **NOT** be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;
2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
12. Propane tanks;
13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. **ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT.** Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our June meeting:

Foreman Ben Collins attended the meeting to provide a report on the water main break at the water treatment plant. This meeting date was the day the major leak was discovered and SCS Contracting were to be arriving the next day which they did. A couple options were provided by SCS Contracting and the council chose to remove and replace 23m of watermain complete with 2 – 6” valves and tee and reducer. The Town received a quote to repair the asphalt area between the post office and the Evashenko building that should be completed in July.

The Administrator reported on having attending Neptune webinars on May 15 & 22; a RESPECT webinar hosted by SUMAssure on May 19 and a risk allocation in contracts webinar on May 26.

Mayor Marv Gerbrandt attended a meeting of DRWU Corporate Partners on May 14 in Dundurn. He has volunteered to sit on a committee to draft a Corporate Bylaw for the DRWU.

The Administrator attended Policy meetings on May 6 & 20th and the regular meeting May 27th by Zoom. Easement agreements from Agvantage Development for the water and sewer mains were discussed and with recommendation of Dellene Church, solicitor for the Town, there was a section refused by the Council.

As Provincial Guidelines for worship services changed June 8, the Council re-opened the Hall and Office as of June 15 to ensure staff were prepared for reopening.

The Administrator's holidays were approved for July 9 – 17th. Because of these dates, the July regular meeting of Council was changed to July 6.

Suzanne Coghill, Animal Control Officer, gave her resignation as she will be moving. The Administrator was instructed to advertise for this position with a new ACO to be hired at the regular meeting July 6.

There was discussion of the Grad parade June 26. The Grads are to be congratulated with a letter from the Town Council.

It was decided that the playground could be re-opened under the Province of Saskatchewan Guidelines for Parks and Outdoor Playgrounds.

Accounts in the amount of \$155,357.88 were approved.

At our July meeting:

The Water Security Agency conducted their annual inspections for the water and wastewater works. There is a requirement for a Wastewater Emergency Response Plan so the Council adopted the draft at this meeting.

The Administrator prepared statistics for phoning and posting notices following the major water break in June. The Assistant took 3 hours to phone 84 people; and it would take 12 man-hours to deliver notices to each user. This is why it is so helpful to have email addresses for water users as it takes a very short time to draft a notice and email the 3 groups of 99 users each.

The Bylaw Enforcement Officer came to Town again on June 12 and June 25.

The Administrator reported having attended a DRWU Policy meeting June 16, HR on June 23 and will be attending the regular meeting July 24 by Zoom. Mayor Gerbrandt reported having attended 3 Corporate Partner committee meetings then learned that on July 3 the rest of the committee quit.

The Building Official inspected the new Fire Hall on July 2 and went over a few details with contractor Vern Harder

The Nuisance Abatement Bylaw was amended to provide for better clarification of properties in contravention of the bylaw.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

Water arrears and the waived penalty were reviewed. There will be some water services disconnected for non-payment. The penalty for late payment of the utilities will be assessed for July so make sure you pay your June bill before the end of July!

A new Animal Control Officer was contracted. You may now contact Andrea Zwarich at 306-715-8141 for any pet concerns.

Approval was ratified for the U12 girls' team to use the ball diamonds provided they follow the Provincial Outdoor Sports and Activities Guidelines.

Approval was ratified for the CAO holiday on June 29.

The new tablets were used for the first time this meeting. Once the Administrator finishes wiping the information, the old Microsoft Surface tablets will be offered for sale for \$500 for all 8 or \$100 each on the Municipal Administrators of Saskatchewan Facebook page first then on all the area Buy and Sell Facebook pages.

RULES RULES RULES!

It's been a while since the Town reminded residents of the Traffic Safety Act. This is what was published in September of 2018.

The Town Council could pass bylaws in regards to Traffic Safety but they would then need to provide enforcement so the Council has decided to leave enforcement up to the Province who provides enforcement for Traffic Safety through the RCMP and the *Traffic Safety Act*. The Council has only passed a bylaw that allows for "all-terrain vehicles shall be permitted to operate on the travelled portion of the whole or any part of a roadway within the Town of Hanley subject to the following condition: the operator is in the act of taking the most direct route to or from his point of origin or destination within the Town of Hanley to or from the Town of Hanley corporate limits"; "must have a valid driver's licence" and "the owner of said all terrain vehicle must have insurance on the all-terrain vehicle".

Some of the general provisions of *The Traffic Safety Act* include a section where a driver's licence is required to drive a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is defined as "a vehicle propelled or driven by any means other than by muscular power". Under this section the legislation says that "no person under the age of 16 years shall operate a vehicle on a highway" (which means any street in town) unless authorized under *The All-Terrain Vehicles Act*; *The Snowmobile Act*; any prescribed regulations or if they have a learner's licence and are accompanied and supervised by another person who meets the prescribed qualifications.

The All-Terrain Vehicles Act states that "no person under the age of 16 years shall operate an all-terrain vehicle" and "no person shall operate an all-terrain vehicle unless he holds a subsisting driver's licence".

The Snowmobile Act gives a little more leeway stating that a person "12 years of age or older but less than 16 years of age and has completed a safety course if that person is: accompanied on the snowmobile by another person who holds a class 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 driver's licence; or is accompanied and supervised by another person who holds a class 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 driver's licence and is operating another snowmobile".

TOWN TIDBITS:

For emergency reasons, please do not park in the back alleys! This could hamper any emergency vehicle such as SaskPower or our Fire Dept if they have to get back there.
