TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **NOT** be accepted at the transfer station:

- 1. Tires:
- 2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
- 3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
- 4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
- 5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
- 6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
- 7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
- 8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
- 9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
- 10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
- 11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
- 12. Propane tanks;
- 13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT. Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

Hanley Housing Authority

Hanley Housing Program

The Hanley Housing Authority on behalf of Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, offers the Social Housing Program. This program is designed to ensure that safe, adequate housing is available to those who could not otherwise afford it. Our tenants benefit from a safe place to call home, a community they can enjoy and peace of mind.

General Requirements for Housing

Applicants must meet income and asset limit requirements to be eligible for the Housing Program. All applicants are required to complete an application form and provide verification of income and assets, as requested.

Review Process

Applications are reviewed for eligibility and approved by the Housing Authority Board of Directors. We utilize a point score system that considers adequacy, suitability and affordability when determining the priority of need.

Once approved, units are allocated upon availability on a priority based, point score system.

Additional Information

Senior housing rent is based on income -30% of gross household income, collected via pre-authorized payment.

Units are smoke free – No smoking in the units by tenants or guests. Housing tenants are responsible for obtaining and paying for their own power. Heat, water/sewer/waste are included in the rent. Yard maintenance is provided. One bedroom unfurnished units include 4 appliances.

Hanley Artificial Ice Project News

The Arena Season is coming to a close for the 2019-2020 season. The Artificial Ice plant started out a little rough but has ended up to be strong and well used with this weather we have had in 2020.

The Artificial Ice project will now work on paying the Town of Hanley the loan back with money raised from the Trip A Month draw, Annual Bunnock Tournament, and the Field of Dreams.

The Artificial Ice Committee worked very hard at making this dream a reality. We just didn't put an Artificial Ice Plant we worked hard to also better the arena:

-Replaced the old clock with a new one; Swinging back doors with a garage door; New tractor door; Spray foamed with fire protection on back wall to help with insulation; Spray foamed and insulated lobby area boards; Safety netting; New players benches (done in 2018); New boards; White Roll and lines for ice surface

With all these upgrades the arena will be enjoyed by many for years to come.

This project would not have been possible if it wasn't for the years of fundraising and support from our community and surrounding areas, the R.M of Rosedale for their contribution, and the Town of Hanley for the loan to make this happen. NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our February Meeting:

Reports were provided for:

Public Works:

- The Foreman attended a Communications and Conflict Seminar on Jan. 21 at the WDM in Saskatoon;
- He also attended a Ground Disturbance seminar in Regina on Feb. 4;
- There was a hydrant replaced due to a wee bit of a leak on the 200 Block of Bodeman Ave. (no we weren't creating a new outdoor skating rink!); 1 curb-stop that was leaking and 1 frozen that required being turned on.
- By the time of this publishing, the trickle lines should have all been turned on WaterWolf District Planning Commission:
- The WW secretary provided a list of quotes for the Water System Assessment that is require again in 2020 for some of the member municipalities. The Town Council agreed that MPE Engineering should be contracted for the region. This is a great example of group purchasing to get a better deal for our municipalities!
- The Province of Saskatchewan has released Targeted Sector Support funding for group projects. The WW group will be applying for a new Regional Official Community Plan and small groups within WW will apply for new Zoning Bylaws as there have been a number of amendments since the last Zoning Bylaw was passed. It was also suggested, within the group, that we could possibly apply for Governance Training for the municipal councils as this is an election year.

Administrator:

- The Administrator attended the 2020 SUMA Convention from Feb. 2 – 5 along with Deputy Mayor Richard McGregor. While there, the two Hanley representatives received a Saskatchewan Municipal Award for Regional Cooperation with some of the member municipalities of WaterWolf.





- The Administrator reported on the Infrastructure Canada Investment Program funding where the Council instructed her to follow-up with quotes for condition assessments of the water and sewage mains. Changing the water meters was also discussed as many of them are now 10 years old and there are some failing each quarter. The Gas Tax fund was discussed at this point also to possibly "top-up" the funding being applied for on the Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws.

NOTES(cont'd)

RCMP:

The Annual Performance Plan was presented to Council and approved. The Policing Priorities for the Saskatoon Detachment for the coming fiscal year, April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021 include: (1) Enforcement – Prolific Offenders – Property Related Crime; Drugs; Traffic; (2) Visibility – Rural Patrols, School and Community Visits and Presentations; (3) Intelligence Lead – Intel Gathering; Rural Crime Watch Groups, etc.

A request from a delegate from the January meeting was tabled till the Feb. meeting as there were only 4 Councillors at the Jan. meeting. The Council denied a request for further tax abatement.

The Administrator was instructed to contact the Town's solicitor to have her proceed with a draft Settlement Agreement as requested by Agvantage Development Corp.

It was decided to purchase three I-Safe portable radar speed signs for the approved SGI Photo Speed Enforcement (PSE) program. There still seems to be speeders on Railway St. and the 764 Grid so hopefully they get the hint when a sign is flashing at them!

An unaudited utility surplus was approved to be transferred to the utility reserve in the amount of \$6,903. A Town bunnyhug was donated to the 2020 Ladies Night Fire Hall fundraiser.

Pursuant to clause 3(e)(5) of the Town of Hanley Parking and Traffic bylaw, the white Sunfire parked at the Hotel is to be removed by a towing company and impounded for 30 days.

Accounts in the amount of \$173,327.45 were approved.

At our March meeting:

Councillor McGregor reported on WaterWolf executive meetings and updated Council on what WaterWolf is doing for our and the member communities.

The Administrator reported on having received the 72-page report created on the Municipal Symposium attended last summer.

The Administrator also reported on having attended the DRWU regular meeting on Feb. 26. The utility will be applying to the Saskatchewan Municipal Board for a decrease in water rates. If this is approved, the Town will also be revisiting rates. After approving the installation of a truck-fill at Pumphouse #2, there was a discussion of truck-fill rates of surrounding communities. A Safety Audit was completed and the maintenance committee will review in more detail. Due to the success at Pumphouse #1, it was decided to install a solar panel system at Pumphouse #2 provided that the company meets all safety requirements requested by the utility. The Board reviewed a Waste Water Utility Maintenance & Operations agreement they are considering with the Dundurn Rural Waste Water Utility. A Grand Opening date was tentatively set for May for the new Office/Shop. Watch for updates. The new Corporate Bylaw hasn't been signed by all parties as of this date so the Board continues to operate under the existing bylaw.

The Bylaw Enforcement Officer from the Commissionaires will be scheduled to do follow-up inspections this spring, tentatively in May. If you got a notice last fall, have you cleaned up your yard yet?

The Administrator was instructed to apply for Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program for sewer main condition assessments and automatic doors for the Community Hall. This grant would pay 73.33% of eligible expenses if approved.

A letter of intent to purchase the old Fire Hall was approved. The funds will be used to further the construction of the new building.

A more detailed Tangible Capital Asset Thresholds and Useful life was presented to Council for discussion and approval.

Accounts in the amount of \$52,083.02 were approved

Thank you to Don Law for taking the time to fix one of our counter drawers in the town office. You solved a lot of frustration!

RULES RULES RULES!

The CAO for the Town attended a webinar and thought the following history was pretty drastic!

History of Building Codes

1758 BC - The Code of Hammurabi

"If a builder has built a house for a man and his work is not strong, and if the house he built falls in and kills the householder, the builder shall be slain."

Luckily Codes have evolved over the years.

National Building Code of Canada was first published in 1941. The NBC for Canada 2015 was adopted Jan. 1, 2018. The National Fire Code of Canada 2015 was adopted Jan. 1, 2018 and the National Energy Code of Canada for Buildings 2017 was adopted Jan. 1, 2018 and came into force Jan. 1, 2019.

The National Building Code 1953 stated "The code is essentially a set of minimum regulations respecting the safety of buildings with reference to public health, fire protection, and structural sufficiency. Its essential purpose is the promotion of public safety through the use of desirable building standards throughout Canada."

As of Jan. 1, 2018, the 2015 Edition of the NBC of Canada is in force in Saskatchewan and its adoption affects every person. "No person shall fail to comply with the edition of The National Building Code of Canada that is in force at the time the permit for the work to be undertaken was issued."

TOWN OF HANLEY TAX NOTICES

TOWN TIDBITS:

The office staff of the Dundurn Rural Water Utility do a calculation that shows the average household water usage.

For 2019 their calculation showed in the chart:

If you use these average gallons per day and multiply them for the quarterly billings that the Town of Hanley sends out, your average usage would be:

2 in Household x 90 days = 6,552 gallons

4 in Household x 90 days = 10,269 gallons

6+ in Household x 90 days = 15,786 gallons

If the consumption showing on your utility bill shows close to

this usage, you are in the average!

Average Daily Consumption of DRWU Subscribers 2 in Household 72.8 gallons per day 4 in Household 114.1 gallons per day 6+ in Household 175.4 gallons per day
