NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our June meeting:

During the Maintenance report, the Council received a concern in regards to sewer services and responsibility of such. A letter was to be sent to the homeowner explaining the responsibilities of the owner and the town.

The Waterworks and Lagoon Compliance inspections as submitted by the Water Security Agency were acknowledged.

That the option by Dusty Rose Backhoe to do a major repair on the wall at the Transfer Station was approved.

The quotes for completion of deficiencies and replacement of roof screws from Vern Harder were approved and the Administrator was instructed to ask for a quote to install the cupboards and sink in the training room along with adding a counter-top.

Richard McGregor reported on WaterWolf meetings held.

The Administrator reported having met with SAL Engineering along with Boyd Construction in regards to finishing work on Wellington Cres and the storm ponds in the Industrial Park.

She attended a Project Advisory Committee meeting on May 13 for the next Asset Management workshop on May 17. Mayor McGregor will also be participating in a recording for future workshops.

The Administrator attended the MuniSask sector meeting on May 19. There was discussion on Advocacy; Procurement; RCMP and policing concerns; the creation of a centralized Board of Revision; Asset Management; and Re-branding. At a vote of members, the organization made the decision to revert back to the name Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA).

The Council was made aware of the Provincial Men's Ball Championship the weekend of Aug. 6.

The Administrator, Admin Assistant and Public Works Foreman attended Safety Supervision training on June 21.

A new Bylaw Enforcement Officer came on June 11. The old files were reviewed to familiarize himself and he planned to return at a later date.

The Administrator attended the Urban Municipal Administrators Association of Saskatchewan (UMAAS) virtual convention on June 9 & 10.

Councillor Maddocks and Mayor McGregor reported on having attended a DRWU Corporate Partner meeting on May 12 and Councillor Maddocks attended the May 26 regular DRWU meeting.

The May financial statements were approved.

The ATV bylaw was re-worded and adopted. An Extension of Time for the 2020 Financial Statements Bylaw was adopted.

The Order to Remedy a nuisance property was reviewed and considered remedied with the file closed.

The quotation by SunCorp Valuations for insurance appraisal services in the amount of \$7,500 was approved.

The Council decided to proceed with the subdivision application as per information provided by Meridian Surveys to subdivide the land where the Centennial Hall and Fire Hall are located.

The Administrator's vacation days for July 2 through July 14 were approved.

The next regular meeting of Council is to be held on July 19/21.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE (cont'd)

Council approved the purchase of a campground sign to be erected over the existing campground highway sign in the amount of \$430.34.

The Administrator was instructed to set up Auto-deposit in online banking for a more secure way to receive e-transfers.

A request by the Hanley Golf Club for a possible building permit was reviewed.

Accounts in the amount of \$99,691.26 were approved.

At our July meeting:

The HR committee reported having met with two employees. Admin Assistant, Charrone White has now completed her 6-month probationary period and her group benefits program will commence.

Mayor McGregor reported on the latest WaterWolf meetings and the development of a webinar for Asset Management.

Councillor Maddocks reported having attended the DRWU regular meeting.

The CAO reported that the contractor has completed building deficiencies as per the Building Official's last inspection. Titanium Mechanical is to be arriving soon to complete the ventilation system.

A new laptop purchase was approved for Public Works.

The use of the Town mower at the fairgrounds by PME certified employees during their voluntary time was approved.

The June financial statement was approved.

Council wished to acknowledge the receipt of a letter of concern in regards to overuse of water.

Utility arrears over 90 days will have water service discontinued on July 26 if all arrears are not paid.

Raelyn McLean was appointed as the Animal Control Officer for the Town.

The Bylaw Enforcement Officer should return on July 28/21 for follow-up on open order to remedy nuisance files.

The 2020 Financial Statement was approved as presented.

A letter of Certificate of Approval for the Agvantage Subdivision Development Storm Ponds and Wellington Cres. road construction will be provided to the developer and his agent.

Regular meetings of Council will be conducted in the Town Office as restrictions imposed by the Province of Saskatchewan for COVID-19 state of emergency has lifted.

CAO vacation days for July 26 & 27 were approved.

A donation in the form of printing services for programs and posters for the Provincial Men's Ball Championship was approved.

Council will support the undertaking to renovate the Hanley Old Park playground and apply for the Canada Community Revitalization Fund Grant.

Accounts in the amount of \$168,696.95 were approved.

TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **NOT** be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;
2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
12. Propane tanks;
13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. **ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT.** Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

RULES RULES RULES!

Did you know that municipalities are required to adopt a Council Procedures bylaw? This bylaw is required to ensure the municipality is in compliance to continue to receive the municipal revenue sharing funding.

The purpose of the bylaw is to establish clear, transparent, consistent and accessible rules for conducting business at meetings, for council members, administrators and the public to follow and participate in governing the municipality and for council in establishing council committees.

It is a lengthy document that covers meetings, council meeting procedures, conduct at council meetings, motions, and committees.

This bylaw, along with all other bylaws of the Town, are on the Town's website Hanley.ca.

Total Fire Ban

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Council for the Town of Hanley an extreme fire hazard condition exists within the municipality,

THEREFORE, pursuant to Bylaw 9/19 the “Fire Restriction Bylaw”, Mayor Richard McGregor issues a Fire Ban

effective immediately, July 20/21, for the Town of Hanley, till further notice.

Section 2. No person shall light, or start or allow or cause to be lighted, ignited or start a fire of any kind whatsoever in the open air during a fire ban.
Section 3. No person shall discharge, or start or allow or cause to be discharged, ignited or started any fireworks of any kind whatsoever during a fire ban.

Propane fueled fires are exempt from the ban.
