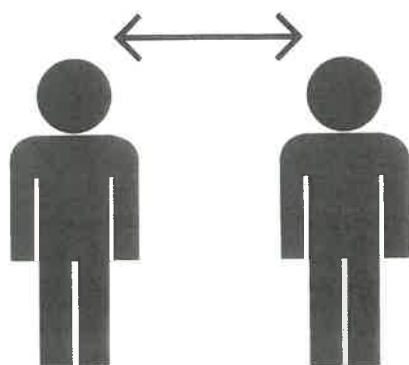

## NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

### At our April meeting:

Public Works Foreman, Ben Collins, attended the meeting for the quarter to provide a report.

- Campbell Safety came to do building inspections on March 16 for the Health & Safety Plan that the Council contracted them for. Ben suggested minor changes to the plan.

The Powered Mobile Equipment training was discussed. Ben has had all required training but perhaps further training could be done for more people.

Pre-inspection checklists will be developed with the office staff.

The Pandemic Plan was also reviewed with minor changes suggested by Council.

The Employee Code of Conduct Policy was mentioned and the HR meeting from March 16 was reviewed briefly.

The Draft Permit to Operate a Sewage Works was presented and accepted.

A request to dump wastewater was discussed and denied on the recommendation of the EPO, Wastewater Operator and CAO.

Mayor McGregor reported on the WaterWolf (WW) Member's meeting on Mar. 23. The Lake Diefenbaker Task Force is looking for a replacement person for Joanne Brochu. Mayor McGregor agreed to participate in the creation of a webinar on Asset Management.

The CAO reported having attended a Zoom meeting for the Planning Advisory Committee for the next round of Asset Management training through WW with FCM funding. The first training for the next round was Mar. 24 and then working on the webinar that will be posted on the WW site.

The CAO reported on the Dundurn Rural Water Utility (DRWU):

There was a follow-up meeting with SaskWater and the City of Saskatoon in regards to the proposed levy that the City will be implementing for new connections.

The Feb. 24 draft minutes of the regular meeting were made available to Council.

On request from the Council, the calculation for large water users monthly charge was presented and what Town's utility bill from DRWU looks like. It was reported that at the March utility reading, there were 294 meters read throughout Town.

The agenda for the March 24 meeting was presented where the DRWU reviewed the 2020 Financial Statement and set the AGM for May 5 by Zoom. The HR meeting was reviewed where the DRWU will be advertising for a temporary Admin Assistant to fill a maternity leave and there was a recommendation for an increase to the current Admin Assistant wage effective May 1.

Mayor McGregor and Councillor Maddocks reported having attended a Partner's meeting on April 7 where the Partners are attempting to create a new Corporate Bylaw for the utility.

Mayor McGregor presented the RCMP Annual Policing Priority to approve and sign.

The CAO reported on progress of the Fire Hall construction. The flooring should be in mid-April; but the ventilation won't be in till mid-June. An updated financial statement was made available to the Council. There may be minor changes to the final cost of the building but otherwise the facility should be complete after the ventilation is installed. A building inspection will be completed by the current building official before passing the file off to the new company. The Fire Chief has a number of training opportunities planned and is hoping to do a number of upgrades for the dept.

## NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE (cont'd)

One item of correspondence of particular interest is the new Education Property Mill Rates as set by the Province: Agriculture – 1.36 mills; Residential – 4.46 mills; Commercial/Industrial 6.75 mills; Resource (oil & gas, mines and pipelines) – 9.79 mills.

The Canadian Union of Postal Workers requested support from municipal councils so a resolution was passed to endorse *Delivering Community Power* and write to the Honourable Anita Anand, Minister for Public Services and Procurement, with its rationale and a copy of this resolution.

A Bylaw to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement with other municipalities for the provision of mutual aid for daily water sampling was adopted.

The CAO reported having attended a Zoning Bylaw workshop and reviewed a number of points that came out of the workshop discussion.

The CAO was instructed to invite a Commissionaires Bylaw Enforcement Officer to attend the next meeting of Council.

Municode Services Ltd. was appointed as Building Officials for the Town of Hanley.

A water and sewer connection application was approved.

The Infrastructure Fee was discontinued for a property where the existing building was removed with no intention of future development.

The CAO was instructed to advertise for two summer students to commence work on June 1 and end August 31, 2021.

The CAO was instructed to apply to the Provincial Mediation Board for consent to proceed with the 30-day final notices for lands with arrears of taxes.

The Finance Committee will be meeting April 23/21 at 1:00 pm to review the budget.

Accounts in the amount of \$53,512.22 were approved.

There has been a few comments or complaints about animal control not dealing with people who do not pick up their pet defecate.

In order to be able to do a citation, the owner has to be witnessed. If witnessed, the complainant would then be required to fill out a Bylaw infraction report. Pictures of action would be an asset.

Without a Bylaw infraction report there is no legal grounds to discuss anything with owner of pet.

**Estimated Time of Occurrence:**

**Animal Description:**

(include type, colour, size and license number if available)

**Suspected Animal Caretaker:** (if available)

**Description of Incident:**

**Evidence Collected:** (pictures, additional witnesses, video, audio recording)

**Name of Complainant:**

(will be kept confidential unless otherwise ordered by court of law)

**Signature of Complainant.**

### TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **NOT** be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;
2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
12. Propane tanks;
13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. **ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT.**

## **RULES RULES RULES!**

Did you know that municipalities are required to adopt a Council Procedures bylaw? This bylaw is required to ensure the municipality is in compliance to continue to receive the municipal revenue sharing funding.

The purpose of the bylaw is to establish clear, transparent, consistent and accessible rules for conducting business at meetings, for council members, administrators and the public to follow and participate in governing the municipality and for council in establishing council committees.

It is a lengthy document that covers meetings, council meeting procedures, conduct at council meetings, motions, and committees.

## TOWN OF HANLEY

**Total Fire Ban**

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Council for the Town of  
 Hanley and the Fire Chief for the Hanley/Rosedale Fire  
 Protection District, an extreme fire hazard condition exists  
 within the municipality,

THEREFORE, pursuant to Bylaw 9/19 the "Fire  
 Restriction Bylaw", Mayor McGregor and  
 Fire Chief Les Kroeger issue a Fire Ban  
**effective immediately, May 11/21, for the**  
**Town of Hanley, till further notice.**

*Section 2. No person shall light, or start or allow or cause to be lighted, ignited or start a fire of any kind whatsoever in the open air during a fire ban.*

*Section 3. No person shall discharge, or start or allow or cause to be discharged, ignited or started any fireworks of any kind whatsoever during a fire ban*

**Propane fueled fires are exempt from the ban.**
