NOTES FROM THE TOWN OF HANLEY

At our December meeting:

Council adopted an Employee Proof of Covid-19 Vaccination Policy.

Charrone White was appointed the Acting Chief Administrative Officer effective January 1st, 2022. Darice Carlson will be staying on at the office in the part time role of Assistant Administrator.

Our new Zoning Bylaw and Official Community Plan were adopted.

A bylaw to close a lane – hall and fire hall subdivision was adopted.

A bylaw to set the 2022 waste management rates was adopted.

Council repealed the previous resolution for the signage on the fire hall and have agreed upon a new design.

The policy regarding Charitable Funds was amended to include that consideration will only be given if the request is submitted by a community member.

In accordance with bylaw 1/13, Council agreed to have two disability parking signs placed at the arena.

Council agreed to match funds put forth by the Recreation Board to be put towards the purchase of additional fire pits for the campground.

A motion to apply unpaid custom work and utility arrears remaining unpaid after December 31, 2021 to taxes was carried.

We will be applying for a Summer Student Employment Grant again in 2022.

Council has agreed to commit additional dollars to the Spray Park Fund in order to meet the requirements for a grant, provided the amount be repaid to the town.

Accounts in the amount of \$99,598.12 were approved.

At the January Meeting:

The HR Committee made a recommendation to hire a candidate for the joint RM/Town position of Recreation Maintenance Personnel.

Regular Meeting dates have been set for the 2022 calendar year. Meetings are scheduled for the second Monday of every month at 7:00 pm, with the exception of October, which will be moved to Tuesday the 11th due to Thanksgiving.

Council repealed a previous Swimming Pool Bylaw because it is now covered in our Zoning Bylaw.

A Bylaw to set Development Permit Fees was adopted.

The Custom Work fee policy has been updated to charge a rate of 1.5 times for any work requested after hours, on weekends, and holidays.

Council set the preferred vendors for fuel, equipment maintenance and repairs, and small tools and supplies.

The Assessment Appeal Fee was set at \$500.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE (cont'd)

Western Municipal Consulting was appointed as our Board of Revision and Development Appeals. The 2021 Campground Financials were reviewed and Council has set the rates for 2022 as follows (same as 2021 rates): Electrical: \$22.00/night

Non-Electrical: \$15.00/night

Weekly Rate: \$125.00

Monthly Rate: \$450.00

Council approved the destruction of documents as per the Records Retention and Destruction Guide. Accounts in the amount of \$137,693.80 were approved.
