NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

The Town and R.M. of Rosedale Councils have requested the Department of Highways to switch the administration of the signage corridor to the Town. Over the next few months, the Town will be working on the next phase of our "clean-up" plan and will be requesting owners of the signs in the highway signage corridor to repair, replace or remove the existing signs that have deteriorated.

At the **January** meeting of Council, Councilor's checklists were reviewed. They had done their homework and the result was that it seemed like we were lacking in Council orientation, policy development, an emergency plan and decision making. The positive points that came from the checklists were council's commitment to this municipality's mission and goals; structure of council committees and officer position is clear; the council members get along; performance reviews for staff; resources are used effectively; reports are understood; council has credibility with ratepayers; and a good working relationship with staff. At that time, the council and administration were working on a policy manual and emergency plan. This was a great exercise for each member of council to determine how each one felt they were doing as a Town Councilor.

In **February**, a new Town Foreman was hired. Ben Collins has taken the position and so far is doing a tremendous job! Thanks to Don Suttie who covered the position for the period prior to getting our new foreman in place. Don will continue to be the Town's weekend & holiday water operator.

The Council passed a Policy Manual in February that is subject to change whenever necessary but will be a good resource for new councillors or staff.

In February, the Administrator attended an "Environmental Code Consultation" to learn that there will be changes to the rules and regulations in regards to landfills and transfer stations, water and wastewater, environmentally impacted sites, and liquid domestic waste. The Code is possibly coming into force this summer but SUMA would like to see more consultation prior to implementation.

The 2011 census was released to find that the Town's population increased from 464 (2006) to 522!

In March, the Council encouraged participation in "Earth Hour Canada".

After much consultation with different resources, the Council passed an Emergency Plan with Darren Grindheim volunteering to be the Emergency Measures Coordinator. Hopefully we never have to use the plan but if it's needed, there are guidelines.

The Town Administrator and School Principal Chris Tucker coordinated a grant application to repave the tennis courts on the school grounds. Chris is hoping that if the 50% funding becomes available that this will be a place that the community can take advantage of with a smooth surface for all different kinds of outdoor recreation. If you would like to make a donation to this project, please contact the Town Office.

Please remember to NOT park on the roadways for extended periods of time. Vehicles on the roadways hamper street maintenance so if the grader has to go around a vehicle it then wastes our foreman's time and he is not able to provide the service of street maintenance in a satisfactory manner.

Everyone in Town will by now have received their March utility bills. Be sure to read through all the stuffers that were included in your billing to help explain the increases.

Remember to use the recycle bins behind the Community Hall as mixed recycling bins. Loraas has been unable to supply us with "blue" bins but have assured the Town Office that multi-material recycling will be accepted in the "green" bins.

Hanley chosen for test of utility advanced metering project

As part of an ongoing program to renew and prepare the province's energy delivery system for the future, SaskPower and SaskEnergy have chosen the Town of Hanley and surrounding area as the first test location for their new advanced metering infrastructure (AMI) project for electrical and gas meters. *Hanley's motto – Consider the Possibilities – certainly aligns with the intent of this important new project.*

"AMI is a key part of SaskPower's plans to renew and upgrade our provincial electrical infrastructure, and will provide a foundation for other ongoing SaskPower projects," said Rob Norris, Minister responsible for SaskPower. "Ultimately, this will help us undertake more proactive system maintenance and deliver a higher level of service to customers."

In August 2010, SaskPower announced that it will be installing approximately 500,000 advanced electric meters across the province, beginning in 2013. These meters will be connected to a wireless communications network that will provide near real-time data on customers' electrical use. The project also includes upgrades to approximately 350,000 SaskEnergy gas meters.

"The AMI project will create significant savings in the day-to-day operations for SaskEnergy, which benefits our customers," said Dustin Duncan, Minister responsible for SaskEnergy. "The technology used in AMI will allow for more accurate billing, which helps customers to better gauge monthly consumption, and the positive impact conservation measures will have on their energy dollars."

During the Hanley field test, SaskPower and SaskEnergy will test approximately 500 new electric meters and 300 gas modules that will be mounted on existing gas meters in the area. This will allow both Crown corporations to verify the system configuration and the wireless communications network the meters will use. SaskPower customers will experience a power disruption of less than a minute while their existing meters are replaced with new AMI meters. Most SaskEnergy customers will see no disruption to their service when the modules are installed on their meters; however, a small number of customers may require the installation of a new meter, which would result in a short natural gas outage.

Hanley was chosen as the location for the field test based on a number of criteria, including a variety of customer types, proximity to SaskPower and SaskEnergy staff and the availability of wireless communications infrastructure.

Installation of the new meters and natural gas modules is scheduled to begin in June, and is anticipated to take two weeks to complete. The field test is slated to be completed by the end of the summer. Residents of Hanley and area will soon get a direct mail piece from both Presidents of SaskPower and SaskEnergy with more details on the project. An official kickoff event in Hanley is tentatively planned for early May.

A second test of the project's remaining major components is scheduled to begin later in 2012 and will involve approximately 8,000 customers. This test will verify the complete end-to-end operation of the system – from the meters all the way to our billing systems and front-line customer care centre. The location of this second test has not yet been chosen.
