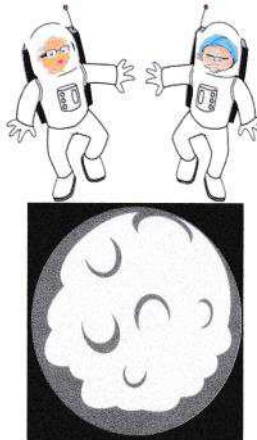

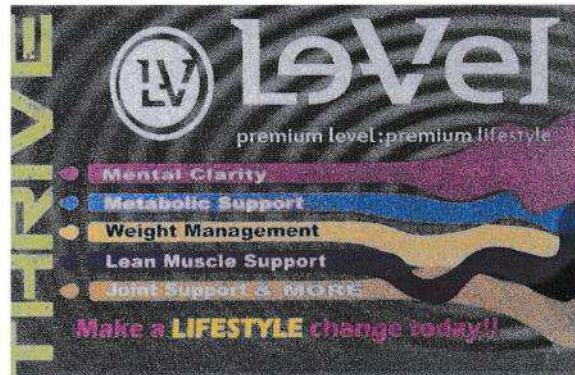

### ***FIRE PROTECTION***

The following is the second in a series of notes taken from “Canadian Underwriter.ca” Canada’s Insurance and Risk Magazine. We will feature notes in the next few editions of the Hermes.

### **APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT**

As a result of the economic belt-tightening of municipalities, more and more fire departments are being asked to do more with less. Municipal associations have lobbied FUS to change the apparatus life cycle requirements to allow communities to operate apparatus and be recognized for fire insurance grading regardless of the age of equipment (and whether or not that equipment is reasonably reliable).

This issue not only affects the apparatus, fire departments are also being asked to do without replacing personal protective equipment (PPE) and to share things like SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus) breathing masks because of their expense.

## ***Animal Control***

### **Are you one of the irresponsible dog owners that allow their dog(s) to run off-leash?**

The Town Office received four complaints in one day that dogs had been running making other owners nervous to walk their dogs, scared to walk in an area of Town as they will be charged by loose dogs, and home-owners having to clean up their yards after the irresponsible owner's dogs have done their duty. Please be a responsible dog owner and keep your dog(s) on-leash or contained. It is not the dog's fault that they are disruptive, **it is the owners!**

**Below is part 6 of a series of notes from**

*"An Enlightened approach to companion animal control for Canadian municipalities":*

### ***RESPONSIBILITIES OF OWNER***

There are many responsibilities that come with pet ownership. Some of these responsibilities are for the benefit of the animal, and some are for the benefit of society. It is important that municipalities enact bylaws that both require and encourage responsible pet ownership. In a fast-paced society where decisions are made quickly and things are easily disposed of, pets often become victims of neglect. As well as costing the animals their quality of life, such neglect also costs taxpayers money in enforcement, pound costs, euthanasia, etc.

### ***NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE***

While the R.M of Rosedale administers the funds for the Fire Department, the Town of Hanley contributes the following:

- Water and sewer, the supplies, insurance and all maintenance for the Fire Department building and contents;
- Administers the Fire Hall project for grant funding, donations and all clerical duties for printing of flyers, posters and tickets for fundraising events;;
- Have so far set aside \$27,000 towards the new Fire Hall project over the last two years and have donated the land for the building;
- The Town of Hanley does Fire Protection articles posted in the Hermes and updates the Town Facebook page when requested by the Fire Dept.;
- A recent donation from the Town of Hanley was made to the R.M of Rosedale for the purchase of an emergency vehicle; and
- Traditionally covers one-half of annual short-fall for the Fire Dept.

### **At the February Meeting:**

Due to the number of frozen lines we had to deal with last spring, the Council and Foreman researched possibilities and solutions over the winter and came up with a trickle line system that over the next couple months were to be installed in the households that were affected. A machine was also purchased that can be connected inside the building that circulates hot water to be a more efficient system for thawing lines. Thankfully, this winter and spring has not been as harsh as last year and frozen lines are not anticipated for this season.

Unaudited water and sewer utility and waste management financial statements were presented to Council and those are included in this edition of the Hermes.

A small donation was made to the Ag Society for the very successful Royal Ball and Superhero Gala held on March 1. Congratulations to the Ag Society for putting on this event that was enjoyed by all!

An easement request by SaskPower was approved.

The Council recognizes the need for staff education. An Accounts Payable webinar was approved for in-office and the Administrator will be attending the Municipal Infrastructure Conference with additional workshop in Nipawin.

The Administrator took a couple holidays and the office was very capably manned by Clerk Marie Sira.



**At our March Meeting:**

Due to Administrator holidays, the regular meeting for March was held on Tuesday the 17<sup>th</sup>.

The Ag Society provided Council with a video of the Grand Entrance for the Royal Ball. The volunteers did a tremendous job of their roles of superheroes and princesses.

The Council entered into agreement for storm water management ponds that will be built in the Industrial development and will ensure that drainage is efficient throughout the property.

Bylaw No. 1/15 being a bylaw to amend the Zoning Bylaw to include temporary work camps was read and second and third time and adopted.

In 2015 the third round of Water System Assessment is required to be completed so after receiving a number of proposals through the WaterWolf Planning Commission administrative office, the Council decided to contract ECO Engineering Ltd.

At the last SUMA Convention, SUMA President Debra Button discussed the possibility of redirecting a per capita of revenue sharing funds for the Municipal Capacity Development Program (MCDP). The Council decided to consider this redistribution and advised SUMA of their decision. The MCDP assists smaller municipalities with building capacity in communities and helps build essential relationships with neighboring municipalities by fostering inter-municipal cooperation. This Council currently has an essential relationship with the members of the WaterWolf Planning Commission and MCDP may also be a benefit in the future.

The Council entered into agreement with Transport Canada for the purpose of a grade crossing closure. This agreement will supply funding for the support of the closure of the railway crossing at the western end of Garfield St.

The Council responded to Community Planning for a subdivision application in the RM of Rosedale supporting the application.

The Council continues to search for a local Animal Control Officer. If one is not found by the date of the next regular meeting on April 13/14, the Council will be contracting an outside enforcement agency. Please inquire at the Town Office regarding this position.

By this time you will have received your Town utility invoice. You will see that there has been an increase to the waste charges. This is a reflection of an increased charge by Loraas Disposal.

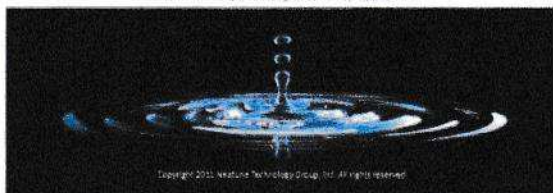

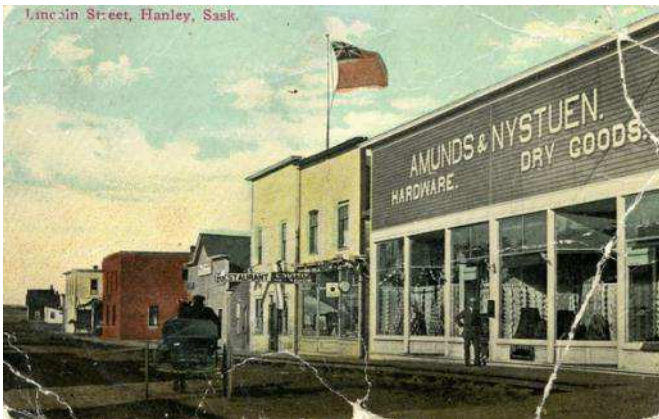
### ***FIRE HALL FUNDRAISING STEAK SUPPER AND COMEDY NIGHT***
