### December Notes from the Town Office

We've survived the first couple of snowfalls and it looks like winter is here. Please remember to keep your vehicles off the streets and garbage carts pulled off the street as soon as possible, so that snow removal can be done more efficiently. Driveways may be cleaned by the Town for a fee of \$100/hr with a minimum of \$25, BUT not until the streets are done. Please call the Town Office if you are unable to have your driveway cleaned otherwise.

The snow is removed from the streets in an order of priority:

- 1 – The main streets into and out of Town (Lincoln & Railway)
- 2 – School Bus route (4<sup>th</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> St. and Bodeman Ave.)
- 3 – Business areas
- 4 – Residential streets.

Thank you to everyone who cleans your sidewalks. Those who walk greatly appreciate it.

A meeting was held with the DRWU Engineers, the Town Engineer, the contractor hired to do the conversion to the water treatment plant, the Town Foreman and one Councilor in regards to the connection to the water pipeline. The water could be connected within 2 – 3 weeks and downtime will be determined when the work has commenced. You may notice a strong chlorine taste for a time because the line coming into the water plant has to be flushed and cleaned with chlorine.

At the **October** Council meeting, it was decided to do a couple more culvert extensions to improve the drainage through Town.

The municipalities utilizing the Dundurn Rural Water Utility pipeline adopted a new Corporate Bylaw. Mayor Marv Gerbrandt was appointed to the Board to represent the Council for the Town of Hanley with Administrator Darice Carlson as an alternate.

At the **November** meeting, the Council met with a couple of members of the arena committee to determine a source of water for flooding the ice because once the pipeline is on-line, the Brightwater water source will be discontinued to the Town. It was decided that a line could be dug in on the south end of the rink to connect to the existing piping in the Zamboni room.

The Public Works Foreman and Administrator met with the Provincial Disaster Assistance Program Engineer. She felt that the crew did a very good job on the road repair and will have a report back sometime in December.

Mayor Gerbrandt had met with surrounding municipalities in regards to the interest in Blackstrap Revitalization.

The Council decided to partner with MidSask Enterprise Region for a Business Retention and Expansion Project.

The Town now has lapel pins for sale at \$2.50 each available at the Town Office.

### ***TRANSFER STATION***

A retaining wall was erected at the transfer station in September. Users of the facility are able to have an easier time getting waste into the Loraas bins by driving up the gravel road, backing up to the retaining wall and dumping into the Loraas bin below. Please remember to fill only one bin at a time! The Operator at the station can tell you which bin to use. The transfer station is for use by the residents of the Town of Hanley and the R.M. of Rosedale. A permit card is required for the Operator to record your usage of the station. If you don't have a card, please call the Town Office and we'll get one made up for you.

The station hours for the winter are: Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The fees for use of the Loraas bin are as follows:

\$25 ½ or ¾ ton truck or utility trailer or anything smaller

\$50 1 ton truck box with hoist

\$150 2 or 3 ton truck

\$200 Tandem truck

The station is designated as a transfer station therefore every item brought into the station must be transferred out.

A meeting was held with the DRWU Engineers, the Town Engineer, the contractor hired to do the conversion to the water treatment plant, the Town Foreman and one Councilor in regards to the connection to the water pipeline. The water could be connected within 2 – 3 weeks and downtime will be determined when the work has commenced. You may notice a strong chlorine taste for a time because the line coming into the water plant has to be flushed and cleaned with chlorine.

There has been some miscommunication in regards to getting the pipeline connected to the Town.

There have been some bad water samples in the Corman Park area during their connection phases so the water can't proceed as dictated by the Ministry of Environment. Once the samples come back clean, and each segment has cleared the Ministry's requirements, the process will be as follows when it's our turn:

1. The line from the ditch @ Railway & Washington will be "pigged". A bullet-shaped piece of foam is forced through the lines as many times as necessary to clean the pipe. 2. That line will be shock-chlorinated. The chlorine will be forced through at high levels and flushed through either outside or to a sewer line. There will be remnants of chlorine that will be noticeable in our water.
3. The water will be tested and when cleared by the Ministry of Environment.
4. The pipes will be connected from the outside pipeline to our cistern to be distributed to each water user.

We will not know how long our "down-time" will be where we are unable to have water coming into our cistern but we have arranged for an outside water hauler to supply our cistern with water. We will try to contact water users to conserve water during the "pigging" and connection stage with mail-outs, posters, Facebook and our Town webpage. When you see some action by Washington and Railway that should mean the work has progressed to here.

Please continue to be patient during this time of conversion. It has been a long process and it isn't finished yet, but is very close now.
