NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

In September:

Brian Sawatzky and Sean Gatin of Agvantage Development Corp attended the meeting to update the Council on the progress of the development west of the rail tracks and to meet Councillors that they hadn't personally met yet. Due to the involved paperwork with the subdivision and development process, an extension to their purchase agreement was awarded for one additional year, to October 18, 2015. Brian and Sean will try to attend a meeting in March of 2015 to provide another personal update. The subdivision application has been approved and they are awaiting the CN Rail design approval and the engineering plans which will hopefully be complete in late winter or early spring so construction can begin. The plans should soon be completed at ISC with each parcel registered with its own title. You will have seen equipment out there already moving some of the massive amounts of dirt that will be required to be moved to assist with the drainage plan. A Project Manager has been contracted by Blair's Family of Companies to oversee the project. He was in to introduce himself at the Town Office and stopped in to visit a couple Councillors. The Council is moving ahead with drafting Zoning amendments to allow for a work camp and passed a "Trailer Licensing Bylaw" to provide for a fee to be charged for temporary buildings if a work camp is established.

Mayor Gerbrandt declared October as "Breast Cancer Awareness" month. Ribbons and other materials were available during the month at the Community Centre bulletin board.

Marie Sira was hired as the new Office Clerk. Be sure to give her a hearty welcome to the Town Office. She is learning a lot and is a great office support staff member. Joyce Armstrong is enjoying her second retirement!

The Town received a donation to the new Fire Hall building along with a purchase price on the sale of the land where the old opera house stood. As the RM of Rosedale had ½ share in the ownership of the land, ½ of the donation was given to them to go towards the purchase of a new Fire truck.

It was approved that Councillor Smith and CAO Carlson attend the SUMA Central Region meeting on September 29. Councillor Smith was unable to attend but CAO Carlson attended. The biggest information to come out of the meeting was the small amount of Federal funding that would be available to communities under 100,000 for the Building Canada Fund – Small Communities Component. The Province has not yet ratified the agreement so applications are not yet being received.

The CAO continues to attend the regular monthly and committee meetings of the DRWU.

In October:

Les Kroeger was honored at the Fire Department BBQ on October 11 where the Fire Dept. conducted their BBO draw with a card to sign by attendees and a gift card to Saboroso's from the Town Council.

Due to the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency initiating a new fee for maintenance requests, the Council passed a bylaw to be enacted January 1, 2015 increasing the building permit administration fee to \$30.

Councillor Smith volunteered to sit on a Policy Committee to review the Policy Manual. She and the CAO spent a day going over every line to present amendments to the Town Council.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

In October:

Infrastructure Investment plans are to be completed by the CAO for the following: Sidewalks - \$6,000 each year for a five year term (to be matched by the Town to equal \$12,000 budget each year for five years); Asset Management - \$10,000; Transfer Station Building - \$5,000; Water main Replacement Project - \$109,109.80. These totals reflect the funding available for the next five years (\$154,109.80).

The Town Office staff requested that the office be closed on November 10 so the regular meeting of Council was conducted on November 6.

The Council authorized proceedings to request titles to parcels of land in arrears of taxes from 2013.

In November:

The by-election was held on November 12 with Giselle Hanson being the successful candidate.

Councillor Richard McGregor was appointed Deputy Mayor for an additional year.

The Building Permit summary was presented to Council. There has been \$407,440 worth of permits approved for 2014.

The first reading of the zoning amendment to allow for temporary work camps was resolved with the required advertising going in the Davidson Leader for two consecutive weeks. The second reading can be done in January.

Mayor Gerbrandt, Councillor Smith and CAO Carlson met with two representatives from the Asset Management Division of the Department of Highways with developer Brian Sawatzky on speakerphone. There was discussion on the impact of traffic on Highway 11 once businesses are established in the Industrial Park. Mr. Sawatzky had initiated this conversation in the spring with Highways.

Foreman Collins will be travelling to Martensville to see how they do a "trickle system" on private water lines to help prevent the problem lines from freezing in the future.

The CAO was instructed to get information and quotation on dust control that the RM of Dundurn uses in Shields and on their busy intersections off Highway 11.

Hanley Rosedale Volunteer Fire Department

The Hanley Rosedale Volunteer Fire Dept has had a few changes since the last edition of the Hermes. On Oct 16th the Fire Dept acquired 2 trucks on the same day. the first one is a 2004 F350 4x4 that carries 300 gallons of water. It has a Honda 13 hp water pump that will greatly improve our performance on grass fires, off terrain calls, and any other calls that are not accessible for regular apparatus. The second truck was previously used by the City of Saskatoon, it is a 1992 pumper that has a 50' telesquirt attached to the truck. This will give us an elevated water stream capable of delivering 1000 GPM of water onto a fire. To our knowledge we are the only department between Saskatoon and Regina that has this capability.

FIRE PROTECTION

The following is the first in a series of notes taken from "Canadian Underwriter.ca" Canada's Insurance and Risk Magazine. We will feature notes in the next few editions of the Hermes.

Recent news in several areas of Canada has reminded the insurance community that public fire protection is far from standardized in this country. Many insurers have forgotten this and have fallen back into the lazy habits of old, which led to the peril of fire being a grave concern across the industry.

The trouble is that almost all Canadian citizens, underwriters included, assume public fire protection is standardized and that simply being Canadian entitles that person to some level of fire protection.

Nothing could be further from the truth.

In fact, the insurance community of Canada came together in 1883 to form the Canadian Fire Underwriters Association specifically to bring order to the chaotic model of public fire protection in the country. The model that was created included having a single index of published fire protection levels that all insurers agreed to use to set premiums.

Municipalities, realizing the amount of public fire protection they provided would be measured by an outside agency, became fairly diligent to invest in public fire protection capacity and mitigate fire risk by implementing and enforcing building and fire codes.

MODEL APPROACH

The way the model of public fire protection works is fairly ingenious. Municipalities manage their fire risk and provide measurable levels of public protection, fire insurance grades are set, and the insurers adjust capacities and premiums to reflect the level of risk and protection on the ground. The whole system is a positive feedback loop that results in insurers being able to underwrite more accurately and municipalities being able to justify the expense of public fire protection.

All Canadians benefit from this system.


ANIMAL CONTROL

This is part 4 of a series of notes from "An Enlightened approach to companion animal control for Canadian municipalities":

NEUTERING (Spay or Castration)

Pet overpopulation is a major problem. It is currently a significant factor in the euthanasia of almost 60% of cats and more than 30% of dogs in animal shelters across Canada every year (CFHS 1997 statistics from Canadian shelters). Municipalities can be part of the solution to this problem by implementing and enforcing bylaws that encourage and reward responsible pet owners who licence, permanently identify and neuter their pets.

An important aspect of responsible pet ownership is neutering of companion animals to prevent the birth of more puppies and kittens needing homes. Municipalities can encourage pet owners to have their pets neutered by implementing preferential licence fees for altered dogs and cats. The differential should be high enough to act as an incentive for pet owners to have their pets neutered. Municipalities can also help by educating pet owners about the health and behavioural benefits of neutering their pets, as well as their social responsibility to do so.
