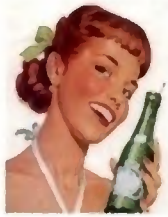
Reminder - the 3rd year has started. You can enter at Trailbreak Services, Brightwater Insurance, the Town of Hanley office, or any Fire Department member.

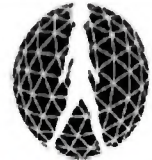

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our **December** meeting: It was decided to forward letters to the Saskatchewan Premier, the Provincial Ministry of Justice, MLA Greg Brkich, SUMA and the Hanley Detachment of the RCMP to show Council's displeasure with the recent approval to allow RCMP members to reside in the City of Saskatoon.

The Animal Control Bylaw was amended to include a "Surrender of Animals" form. If an animal is surrendered to the Animal Control Officer, a fee of \$70 plus any fee that may be charged to the SPCA must be paid prior to the acceptance of the animal.

Due to the increasing cost of gravel, the fee for 1 yard of gravel delivered was increased to \$30 based on availability.

The transfer station hours were reduced to being open from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Our operator is finding that there aren't that many people that show up on a Saturday and it should save the Town some money by decreasing the hours. She also had a lot of difficulty finding substitute operators so had to close the transfer station over the Christmas season. The Ministry of Environment requires that we have a manned station.

The Summer Employment Student Grant through Canada Summer Jobs initiative was applied for. The application dates are earlier than previously so approval can be awarded in time for budget planning.

At our **January** meeting: Rob Eyre and Bruce Janes from the RCMP attended our meeting to discuss policing in the area.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE (Continued)

A Bylaw was passed to close and sell a portion of the east/west road that crosses the tracks at the end of Garfield St. A subdivision application will be submitted to Community Planning from the developer of the land west of the tracks once all the paperwork has been signed. This road will be integrated into a larger parcel on paper and will physically remain there until the land is surveyed and construction begins.

The list of lands in arrears of taxes was presented to Council and the said list was to be advertised in the Davidson Leader and posted in the Town Office. This is the first step in Tax Enforcement and additional costs are added to the tax roll as they are incurred (interest at 1% per month compounded, advertising and title search costs, etc).

Pursuant to section 113 of *The Municipalities Act*, the employee bonds were laid before Council with no changes required.

Loraas Disposal notified the Council of an increase in the cost of garbage carts with little variance to the inclusion of recycle carts. The Council decided to conduct a survey of the cart users as to whether they would support door-to-door recycling services with waste and recycling picked up on alternate Mondays and eliminating the 30 yard recycling bins behind the Hall thereby saving an approximate \$7,000 per year (based on a 2013 report) at a cost of \$14 per month; or continue as is with a cost of \$14 per month. If replies were not received, the assumption would be made that the user would support whatever decision Council made. This was to be decided upon at the February meeting.

The subdivision application by AgVantage Development Corp. was approved, signed and returned. Once the RM of Rosedale approves their involvement in the development, this application can be forwarded to Saskatchewan's Community Planning department. Community Planning must make a decision on the application within 90 days so with the application not yet submitted, this may run into June or July at the earliest. Development or construction may not begin until such time that the subdivision is approved by the Province. A servicing agreement was also entered into with this company.

It was approved that the Administrator attends a Panel Discussion on Emergency Management at the Diefenbaker Centre; and Councilor Richard McGregor and the Administrator will be attending the SUMA Convention in February in Regina.

The Council was approached for and gave their support in fundraising efforts to install artificial ice in the rink. There will be a meeting on Feb. 26 @ 7 p.m. at the Arena. The Committee and Council are encouraging the community to attend this informational meeting to see if there is community support for the project.

The Council also approved the inclusion of paying the telephone bill at the Local Library. The Town and RM each pay half of all utilities to provide library service so make sure you visit your local library; your librarian is a wealth of information of library services!

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE (Continued)

Our Animal Control Officer will be sending out notices and pursuing those of you who have not purchased animal tags for 2014. Even if your animal is chipped, it needs to be registered with the Town Office. The Officer is sending out warnings to those who haven't yet purchased and will be fining \$50 for those who do not purchase by Feb. 24. Animal registration licenses are available at the Town Office for \$25 per animal (this includes cats!).

RECYCLING SERVICES

At the February Council meeting and following the survey as noted in the "Notes from the Town Office" (76 votes were returned with 48 voting to change to the 2 bin system and 28 voting to have services stay the same), the Council decided to change waste management services to the 2 bin system. This system will ensure that each address will be more accountable for their waste and recycling and you will no longer be subsidizing the recycling use of others. The cost is \$14 per month and will be billed quarterly on your utility bill at \$42.00. For only \$1.25 more per month, you can drop your recycling at your own home rather than loading it up, arriving at the big recycle bins only to find they are full!

Loraas will be bringing the "blue" carts on or about April 1. The big blue recycling bins behind the Centennial Hall will be removed at that time. Each cart will have an assigned number for your address which will be accounted for in the Town and Loraas Offices. The Town Office will send out a calendar of the scheduled days for pickup as the time draws closer. You will have the black garbage cart picked up one Monday and the blue recycling cart picked up the alternate Monday. Recycling information will be provided over the next couple of months. Watch your mailbox or pick up information at the Town Office!

Remember that to have efficient street maintenance, the carts MUST be returned to a safe place on your property Monday evenings.

Blue Recycling Container - Allowable Items

- **Containers** – *please rinse and remove all caps and lids, place into the bin loose – do not bag or tie (except plastic bags)*

- **Includes:** water bottles, soft drink cans and bottles, beer cans, milk jugs and cartons, detergent bottles, plastic bags and clean food wrap (place inside another bag and tie closed), windshield washer fluid bottles, tetra-pak boxes, tin cans, juice containers, yogurt and margarine containers
- Plastic containers must have the recycling arrows and a number inside, as shown below.

Items Not Allowed: motor oil jugs, plastic toys, outdoor lawn furniture, contaminated food wrap, plastic or wire clothes hangers, hazardous chemicals, glass cups or dishes, ashtrays, window glass, auto parts and scrap metals, Styrofoam, plastic pipe, light bulbs, batteries, plastic containers without the recycling arrow and a number inside

- **Paper and Cardboard** – *please do not bag or tie*

- **Includes:** newspapers, magazines, catalogues, office paper, envelopes with or without windows, junk mail, cardboard, cereal boxes, tissue boxes, paper towel cores, bathroom tissue cores, paper bags, gift wrap, telephone books, hardcover books with covers and spine removed
