Tidbits of Info—Town of Hanley

Town of Hanley residents: Town of Hanley Bylaw No 3/84 states that each house and/or building <u>shall</u> bear the number assigned to the frontage on which the front entrance is situated. Numerals indicating the official number for each house or building or each front entrance to such building <u>shall</u> be posted in a manner as to be visible from the street on which the property is located. This requirement is in place for your safety in emergency situations; for example, if an ambulance is needed at your house and it is not numbered, it will take more time for the driver to locate your house if a number is not easily seen.

Reminder: If you plan on making a payment on a General Invoice through a "UTILITY" payment, please email the Town Office so we may direct the payment correctly otherwise it will just get applied to your utility account. For example: if you have had custom work done and you have set up your utility account number as the payee through your on-line banking, your payment will not be applied towards that custom work. Unless you tell us <u>immediately</u> and directly with an email or phone message, it will be incorrectly applied. Our email address is: <u>townoffice@townofhanley.ca</u>

Also, e-transfer payments are accepted for taxes, utilities or general invoices (provided a description is given to apply the payment to).

During the week, our lunch hour runs from 12:30 - 1:30 p.m. on a daily basis. Please arrange to come by the office or make your phone call before or after that time. Even if the lights are on and we are in the office, this is our break time. Thank you for your co-operation.

If your garbage cart is full and you feel the urge to creep on your neighbor and put your garbage in their cart...PLEASE DON'T. Maybe consider your recycling options to produce less garbage. If you reside in the R.M., there is recycling provided at the R.M. Shop.

Are you planning a controlled burn outside of Town limits? If you are, please call the Provincial Control Burn Line @ 1-866-404-4911. If the Fire Dept. responds to a controlled burn, you will be charged for the call-out!

GET OUR COMMUNITY MOVING CHALLENGE

The Town is registering for the "Get our Community Moving Challenge". If we win, the money will be going towards refurbishing the track on the school grounds. The School Community Council has gone halfway in the fundraising for this project so the \$10,000 win from this contest will allow the project to be completed this year!

In order to win this challenge, people must create a profile either individually or by family and log in everyday to add their physical activity for the day.

Instructions for this program are below and notes will be sent home with each child from the school. You don't have to live in Hanley to allocate your daily activity but we want you to register with the Town of Hanley to help us win this \$10,000.

CHALLENGE RULES FOR CREATING AN INDIVIDUAL PROFILE · Each individual may have only one profile, which includes unique personal information. One profile can be created from a specific computer address and the address will be recorded. You will be required to provide your home address, postal code and phone number in addition to your email address. Saskatchewan in motion will be monitoring all profiles to ensure that individuals are not creating duplicate profiles. · Children, who are 13 years of age at the start of the Challenge, may create an individual profile to participate in the Challenge. · Before creating a profile, individuals must read, understand and agree to abide by all the rules and regulations of the 2015 Challenge. · Each person can allocate only their personal physical activity minutes, up to 120 minutes a day. · Participants do not need to be residents of Saskatchewan or the community where they are allocating their minutes. · By creating an individual profile you consent and agree to give Saskatchewan in motion permission to collect and use this personal information to administer the Challenge.

CHALLENGE RULES FOR CREATING A FAMILY PROFILE · Each family may have only one profile which will request unique personal information. One family profile can be created from a specific computer address and the address will be recorded. You will be required to provide the number of people in your family, your home address, postal code and phone number in addition to your email address. Saskatchewan in motion will be monitoring all profiles to ensure that individuals are not creating duplicate profiles. • Only a parent or legal guardian can allocate the minutes of physical activity of their child (or children) at school, at home and in the community. • Parents and children who are part of a family profile may not create an individual profile. • To be eligible to create a family profile, individuals must read, understand and agree to abide by all the rules and regulations of the 2015 Challenge. • By creating a family profile you consent and agree to give Saskatchewan in motion permission to collect and use this personal information to administer the Challenge. • A family can allocate up to 120 minutes of physical activity a day for each family member.

CHALLENGE RULES FOR REGISTERING MINUTES WITH A COMMUNITY Communities, that meet all of the eligibility criteria, will be featured on the Get Our Community Moving Challenge website as of 1:00 p.m. on February 23, 2015. Individuals can create a personal or family profile as of 12:01a.m. on February 23, 2015. Any minutes added before the challenge start will be cleared as all accounts will start at zero. Each individual or family member can allocate up to 120 minutes a day, which may include physical activity done at home, at school, or in the community. Each individual or family group can log in multiple times between 12:01 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. CST each day during the challenge, and can add minutes each time, until you reach the maximum of 120 minutes of physical activity. The sole determination of time will be the Saskatchewan in motion server. Each individual or family group is responsible to enter their physical activity minutes can be submitted. Schools cannot allocate the minutes of physical activity done by their students. Once the minutes have been allocated to a specific community, the minutes cannot be withdrawn or transferred to another community. Community rankings will be shown on the website, but the actual number of minutes allocated to individual communities will not be shown.

Notes From The Town Office—Town of Hanley

At the December Meeting:

Giselle Hanson was sworn in as your newest Town Councillor. Congratulations Giselle!

A new bylaw was passed amending the Building Bylaw to allow for temporary storage units during construction. After review by the Policy Committee, the amended Policy Manual was adopted in its entirety. Having a good Policy Manual and using it as a living document allows for consistency in operations of the municipality.

Unfortunately, Loraas has informed Council that there will be an increase in rates. The Council was forced to increase the waste rates that are billed quarterly on your utility bill. You will see an increase of \$4 per month on the "waste" portion of your utility bill to account for Loraas's increase.

SaskEnergy was contracted to increase the pressure of natural gas to supply the external generator at the water distribution plant.

The Human Resources Committee reviewed the employee wages and the recommendation to Council was passed to award each employee with a 3% increase for 2015 to allow for cost of living. As the Policy Manual allows for 5 vacation days to be carried over to the next year, CAO Darice Carlson and Foreman Bentley Collins were each paid out their overage of vacation pay.

CAO Darice Carlson was approved to attend the SUMA Convention in Feb. No Councilor's are able to attend.

As some custom work was not paid when invoiced, Council approved adding those charges to the tax roll of any land owned by the person who requested the work if not paid by December 31/14.

A development permit application by Cooltech Construction was approved to allow for a construction trailer to be placed on First St. beside the area of construction.

A resolution was made to apply for the New Building Canada Fund – Provincial Territorial Infrastructure Component – Small Communities Fund for the watermain replacement project. The Council has had a study done on a key few of the watermains to determine an opinion of probable cost.

As the Fire Hall project was unable to proceed in 2014, the Council allocated an additional \$13,500 to a reserve fund for this project.

A letter was sent to SaskTel requesting that the long distance charges from Hanley to Saskatoon be removed. A reply was received that this program is no longer available and that different long distance packages were made available by SaskTel to help reduce your costs.

At the January Meeting:

The list of lands in arrears of 2014 taxes was presented to Council. That list was advertised in the Davidson Leader.

Annual appointments and Committee Advisory positions were volunteered for by Council. For more information on these positions, please see the Town of Hanley website following the adoption of the January minutes at the February meeting.

Utility users in arrears over 90 days were to have the water service disconnected if payment arrangements were not made.

A donation was made to the Artificial Ice Committee's "Hockey Day" to be held January 17/15.

A resolution was made to register the community for the "Get our Community Moving Challenge" and if declared the winner, the funds would be used for rejuvenating the running track at the school. Watch for posters, notes from school and more info in this edition of the Hermes.

Fire Protection

The following is the second in a series of notes taken from "Canadian Underwriter.ca" Canada's Insurance and Risk Magazine. We will feature notes in the next few editions of the Hermes.

VOLUNTEERISM DOWN

Roughly 80% of fire departments in Canada are manned by volunteers. That means that when a building is on fire, there will be several extra minutes in total response time as firefighters need to travel from their homes or places of work to the fire hall before suiting up and responding to the fire scene with an engine.

In years past, before the digital age, participating as a volunteer on the local fire department was a fun way to be part of the local community. It seems, however, that people's lives have become busier and volunteering on the local fire department is seen more as a second job than a way to be part of the community.

This is exacerbated by businesses that historically were very supportive of volunteer fire departments, but that in recent decades have pulled their support. In fact, more and more businesses are advising their employees that they are not allowed to leave while on shift.

This may be understandable since businesses are focused on producing their own financial results, which are unlikely to benefit from having employees called away in the middle of shifts, leaving their posts unmanned.

There are many factors that have resulted in the downward trend in volunteer firefighting, including location economics. Firefighters often do not live and work in the same town.

In Vancouver, for example, few firefighters can afford to live in the city, so they have homes in cities like Coquitlam, Maple Ridge or Surrey, which may result in their place of residence being farther away from the fire station.

An interesting side note is that many insurers assume large cities are 100% career fire forces, but this is not the case. More and more cities are looking to reduce their overhead by cutting fire department budgets and fire departments are turning to volunteer or paid oncall models in an effort to maintain some level of fire protection.

The biggest factor in reduced volunteerism seems to be apathy. More people are assuming that they do not need to contribute as someone else will.

When it comes to public fire protection, however, this can have very serious consequences. A lack of standards for training firefighters has been identified as a serious problem.

There are actually a number of standards for training firefighters, but they are expensive and time-consuming to implement. The result is that most communities do not implement them.

In fact, a recent study for British Columbia firefighters found it was not economically feasible to train firefighters to the minimum National Fire Protection Association Standard Level 1.

For volunteer fire departments, this is a big problem, and for the communities that they serve, there is a significant liability exposure in having emergency responders who are not certified Level 1 firefighters responding to very dangerous incidents on behalf of the community. This is beyond the serious risk to firefighters themselves.

Animal Control

This is part 5 of a series of notes from "An Enlightened approach to companion animal control for Canadian municipalities":

NUMBER OF DOGS AND CATS PERMITTED

Establishing an arbitrary limit on the number of dogs and cats permitted in a dwelling does not address concerns about irresponsible pet ownership, but rather, may punish responsible pet owners who are providing proper care to their companion animals.

Concerns about inhumane treatment of the animals or disturbance in the neighbourhood are addressed in Section D. However, some urban municipalities may wish to establish a limit on the number of dogs and cats permitted in one dwelling. A dwelling housing more than the maximum number would be considered a kennel or cattery and would be subject to municipal bylaws applying to such establishments.

Working smoke alarms save lives

Test yours every month!

Install smoke alarms on every level of your home.

Larger homes may need additional smoke alarms to provide enough protection.

In the kitchen, smoke alarms should be installed at least three metres from cooking appliances. This helps prevent false alarms.

Check smoke alarms using the test button at least once a month or as recommended by the manufacturer.

Change the battery in your smoke alarm once a year.

Dust or vacuum smoke alarms annually and/or whenever the battery is changed.

Make sure everyone in the home understands the warning sound of the smoke alarm.

Immediately replace smoke alarms when they are ten years old or if they do not respond properly when tested.


