
HANLEY NEW SIGN CONTEST

REMINDER

Remember to purchase your dog and cat licenses for 2010 prior to February 1st for \$25.00 for each animal. Our bylaw states that "every owner of a cat or dog that is over 4 months old shall, within 30 days of becoming the owner, obtain a license for each cat or dog." The owner of the cat or dog shall ensure that the animal wears a collar to which

the tag shall be attached whenever the animal is off the premises of the owner.



The licenses expire December 31st of the year purchased. If the dog or cat has an identification tattoo or microchip, the tag is not necessary but that information must be provided to the Town Office prior to Feb 1 along with the annual license fee.

Neptune Water Meters

Approximately 200 of the 263 new wireless Neptune water meters have been installed in the Town and area as of the end of February 2010. On February 24th & 25th the Town Administrator and Foreman received training and instructions on utilizing the new remote handheld meter reader. This remote reader will allow readings to be taken by just driving down the streets of the Town. A wireless signal is sent from the individual water meter to the handheld meter and then once back in the office, the readings can then be transferred into the computer program to read the amount of water that has been used by the individual residences/businesses. As it stands now, it is planned to use the new system for the March billing process. Those with the old meters will still need to have their meters read manually.

Boil Water Advisory

The recent 'Boil Water Advisory' that was issued by the Town of Hanley originates with Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment. Pursuant to clause 32(1)(a) of The Environmental Management and Protection Act 2002 a Precautionary Drinking Water Advisory is issued due to a power outage and a system depressurization and therefore the safety of the Town's drinking water supply cannot be ensured at all times. Therefore, pursuant to Clause 32(1)(b) of The Environmental Management and Protection Act 2002, consumers must be notified to boil water used for drinking purposes and other activities that water may be ingested, not to drink from public drinking fountains, ensure that younger children and infants are sponge bathed.

The Town's water is still the same as it always has been, however, under the newer regulations it is felt by the government that a Precautionary Drinking Water Advisory must be issued whenever there is a power outage and the water system is depressurized. The Town has been looking into purchasing a generator to alleviate the depressurization whenever we have a power outage, however, as of yet, they have not been able to purchase a suitable generator. Be advised the Town will be issuing a 'Boil Water Advisory' whenever we have a power outage and a depressurization.

There are approximately 260 individual users of the Town's water supply, so when a 'Boil Water Advisory' is issued, it takes time (4 to 5 hours) to contact each and every user (via phone, e-mail or posting a note on the person's door). The Town is looking into a method of simplifying the process but as of yet they have not come up with a method that will allow them to contact everyone in a suitable time frame.

The WaterWolf Advisory Planning Commission

The WaterWolf Advisory Planning Commission is now before the Hon. Jeremy Harrison, Minister of Municipal Affairs Ministry. Ratification of the first and largest independent land commission in the history of the province is imminent. The Town of Hanley with the Villages of Kenaston and Hawarden, together with the R.M. of McCraney and the R.M. of Rosedale are just 5 of the 37 rural and urban municipal governments together with Whitecap Dakota First Nation who have partnered to form the WaterWolf Advisory Planning Commission.

The WaterWolf Advisory Planning Commission goals are best laid out in the draft 'Growth Management Plan' (below) that was presented to the stakeholders for their approval and input in the spring of 2008;

Building strong communities for long-term prosperity, environmental health and social well-being depends on managing change and promoting efficient land use and development patterns. This supports strong, livable and healthy communities, protects the environment, public health and safety, stimulates economic growth and sustains municipal financial well-being over the long term.

At its Best, the WaterWolf Planning District will have:

- A land use concept plan that generally outlines the future land uses that may develop over time within the District.
- The District as a desirable location for future economic activity, employment opportunities, residential growth and major tourism destination.
- Identified development opportunities that will improve the enjoyment, health and well-being for the residents and communities within the District.
- Detailed planning areas that acknowledge the need for environmental management of the South Saskatchewan River Watershed.
- An inter-municipal framework to provide for mutual implementation of land development, economic development, transportation systems and infrastructure.
- Maintained and enhanced relationships amongst local levels of government for a sustainable region through ongoing partnerships with government agencies, respectful of municipal autonomy.

And finally:

Open lines of communication continue to develop between urban and rural municipalities and the first nation, to share experience, innovative ideas, and best practices to resolve conflict and pursue opportunities for regional benefit.'
