**Hanley Centennial Committee**

The Centennial Committee held their AGM on April 15 in the Clubroom. The 2012 Financial Statements were reviewed and accepted. Clint & Pat Sira generously donated new mugs which will be shared by the Hall and Seniors'. It is nice to have a number of matching mugs!

A few maintenance issues were discussed, namely: electrical – when too many plug-ins are used in the kitchen, the breakers blow. Extra breakers were added a few years ago but maybe if funding becomes available, the electrical can be improved; and the main doors require spot welding and sweeps; the window was replaced in the one door by Al Hoffman.

Dale Bagnall's caretaking services were retained. We have received a number of compliments on how well the hall is looked after by him.

The Preschool will be vacating their room following the end of their school year. The Hall Committee will be providing this room to Home Care for a Nurse's office and a future Home Care clinic will be established. The Committee thanks the RM of Rosedale for providing a temporary space on the north end of the Council Chambers for the use of the Home Care Nurses.

Over the next year the Committee will be reviewing the Incorporation Bylaw, as it has become outdated, and the rental rates.

The Club 52 was discussed and a request was made to the community for a volunteer to operate the Club 52. Cindy Hoffman graciously volunteered for this position. Club 52 is a great fundraiser for the Hall.

### **NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE**

**At the March Council meeting:** the Official Community Plan/District Plan and the Zoning Bylaw were given third readings and adopted. The Plan & Bylaw were then forwarded to our District Community Planner to compile with the other municipalities in the WaterWolf District to be sent to the Minister for approvals.

The Council also entered into agreement for a District Board of Revision to hear assessment appeals. 2013 is a revaluation year so you will have seen a marked increase in your assessment that more closely reflects the value of your property.

**At the April Council meeting:** the 2012 Financial Statements were accepted as prepared by Baert, Cameron, Odishaw, & LaCock Chartered Accountants. A synopsis will be included in your Town tax notice but the complete financial statements can be viewed at the Town Office.

Parcel B (west of the tracks & north of the road going west out of Town) was sold to AgVantage Development Corp. for more development on the entire property west of the tracks.


An annual grant was awarded to the Hanley Branch Library.

**At the May Council meeting:** an Account Executive and Manager of AonReedStenhouse attended the meeting to inform the Council of the benefits of reciprocal insurance through SUMAssure. Due to the benefits of pooled resources, a share in profits, knowledge, control over claims handling and to minimize the cost of insurance over the long run, the Council decided to transfer the Town's policy to SUMAssure.

A number of concerned residents also attended the meeting to discuss Animal Control. The Council decided to contract Ed Applin, Bylaw Enforcement Officer to assist the Animal Control Officer in dealing with chronic animal control problems.


Steven Sira was hired as the summer student to begin his employment July 2. The Council thanks all applicants who applied. BVH Consulting will certify foreman Ben Collins, Steven and Councillor Townsend (as sponsored by the Ag Society) on the mower and Steven on the tractor so he is better equipped to assist Ben.

Community Event Permits were issued to the Ag Society for the Ag Fair June 21 & 22 and to the Hanley Elks for a Street Dance on June 22.

### **Hanley Fire Department**

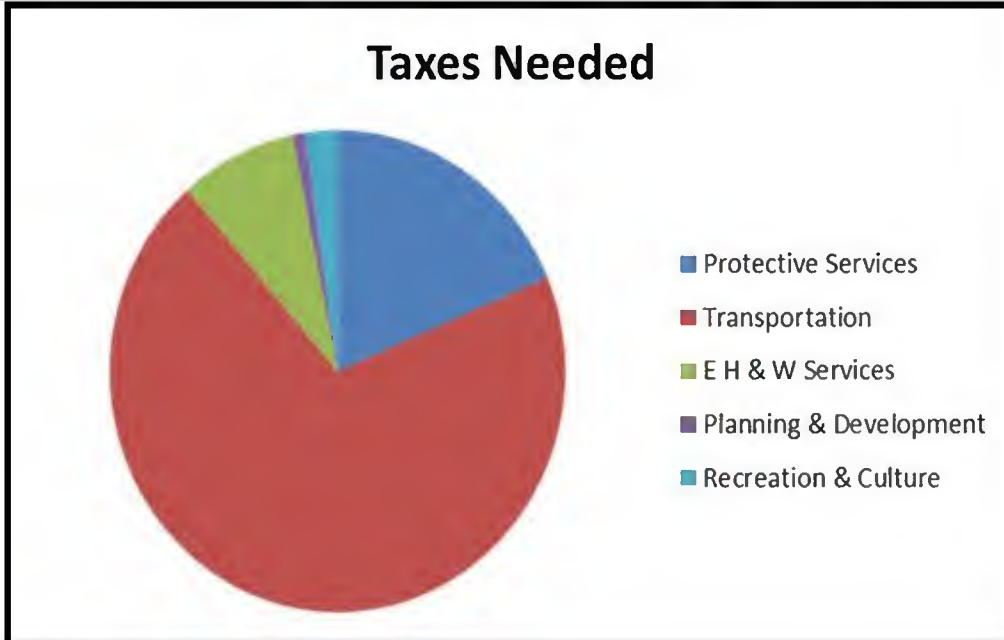
***The Hanley Fire Hall is in need of many repairs and is actually becoming too small for the apparatus and equipment that is housed there. As well there really is no room for any training inside the hall at the present time.***

***With that in mind, fundraising efforts have started in an effort to build a new fire hall building that will be able to house the equipment and allow some training in the building.***

***At present time it is unknown whether the Fire Department will set up an account to receive donations, or whether it will be run through the Town. Ultimately the Town does own the building, so it probably makes sense to go that route. Stay tuned for details.***

**NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE**

The 2013 Budget was adopted. The uniform mill rate for property is set at 7.0 mills with a mill rate factor of 1.18 for Commercial property. As the assessments throughout Town generally doubled, the tax levy could remain relatively the same as 2012 with a decrease from 16.22 mills to 7.0 mills. The minimum taxes will remain the same so if you see an increase in your bottom line, it is likely the school portion of taxes where the mill rate is set at 5.03 residential and 8.28 commercial which is a decrease from 9.75 residential and 12.25 commercial from 2012. The budget may be inspected at the Town Office during regular office hours. A pie chart that indicates where the percentage of your taxes is going is below: (General Government expenses are covered mostly with a Municipal Operating Grant from the Province.)



The water and sewer utility has its own budget and is self-sustainable. (Your water and sewer bill pays for all these expenses.)
