

ANIMAL CONTROL

This is part 3 of a series of notes from "An Enlightened approach to companion animal control for Canadian municipalities":

LICENCING / IDENTIFICATION

One of the roles of municipal animal control bylaws is to encourage responsible pet ownership through licencing, permanent identification and spay/neuter requirements. The preferred methods of permanent identification are micro chipping and tattooing (The Town of Hanley has no method of reading the chips and residents MUST purchase a tag).

Tags should also be worn (on break-away collars for cats) as proof of ownership so that animals may be returned to their owners sooner, often by neighbours, without incurring pound costs. Municipalities should offer incentives for pet owners to comply with the bylaw by reducing licence fees and fines for cats and dogs that are spayed or neutered and permanently identified. Compliance can be encouraged by implementing stiff fines for failing to obtain and wear a licence.

Responsible pet owners save municipalities money by reducing the number of dogs and cats running loose, by preventing indiscriminate breeding and by keeping their pets under control. Revenue from licencing and fines can be allocated to offset pound costs and for education programs in the municipality.

Cat licencing requirements enable cat owners to contribute to the cost of animal control in the municipality, a cost that has traditionally been borne by dog owners. Most municipal pounds and humane societies take in many more cats than dogs, resulting in higher budget allocations for cats in their care. In addition, less than 5% of cats are claimed by their owners, compared to over 30% for dogs (CFHS 1997 statistics from Canadian shelters).

We would like to thank the people of Hanley and district for the visits, food, cards and phone calls we received after the death of our son Jeff. NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At the July meeting:

The meeting was held on July 7 as the Administrator was taking holidays the week of the second Monday.

The Administrator was approved for a holiday day Sept. 9 so she could grandparent for the day.

Council was forced to declare a couple yards as nuisances. Please remember to keep your yards tidy with the grass cut and weeds and trees under control to keep our Town looking great.

The Town entered into a funding agreement with Multi-Material Stewardship Western. This agreement pays a small amount of funds to the municipality that helps to keep costs of recycling at a minimum.

The Town's insurance policy was renewed through SUMAssure with an inclusion of Professional Liability Insurance requirement. SUMAssure is owned by urban municipalities from all over Saskatchewan and is devoted exclusively to providing subscribers with the best possible insurance coverage at the best possible price for their community.

A bylaw was passed to amend the Building Bylaw. Due to the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) implementing a \$20 fee per maintenance inspection, the Town will be adding an additional \$20 fee on January 1, 2015 for building permits to cover this cost.

At our August Meeting:

Between meetings the Administrator and one Councillor did a municipal facilities tour. They then recommended that a municipal facilities tour be implemented for new Councillors. This was noted in the Policy Manual to do so.

More reminders and another nuisance declaration were sent out to get yards cleaned up.

The Council decided to hire an Office Clerk. More hours were needed and Joyce, the current admin assistant decided she would like to retire to spend more time with her family, hobbies and volunteer duties. The new clerk will have big shoes to fill as Joyce has been an exceptional staff member for the Town! In a pinch, we may still be able to get her in to the office but in the meantime has been training the new Clerk. After a difficult review process, the Employee Relations committee conducted interviews and at the September regular meeting made a recommendation to the Council to hire Marie Sira as a flexible part-time Clerk. Welcome Marie!

Offers and counter offers went between Evashenko Trucking, the Town and the RM for Evashenko Trucking to purchase the lots where the old Opera House stood on Lincoln St. If the weather holds, you may see some construction going on at that site as early as this fall.

A servicing agreement was finally reached with Agvantage Development Corp for the land across the tracks. Subdivision approval was granted by Community Planning after that piece of the development was complete. Surveyors have been on-site to stake the separate property corners. Over the winter, engineering plans can be formulated and the subdivision plans submitted to land titles for registration. Hopefully by spring we can see some construction begin. Their website is on-line with a link on the Town's website; check it out at www.agvantagedevelopments.com.

After five years of dedication to Town Council, Dale Bagnall handed in his resignation. By-election information can be found in this edition of the Hermes.

Due to Thanksgiving Monday being the second Monday of the month, the October Council meeting will be held on Oct. 6 at 7 p.m. in the Town Office.

Over the last couple of months, the Administrator has been busy attending Committee and regular meetings for the DRWU. She is involved in the Finance Committee to ensure the utility's finances are sustainable but affordable for all users and specifically the bulk users. She is also on the Policy Committee which is currently reviewing the subscriber application and agreements, and developing a Policy Manual. Unfortunately, all the meetings and the Administrator's holidays meant that the Town Office was closed. Now that a new Clerk has been hired, the office should stay open while the Administrator is away. Thank you for your patience!

There have been a number of new people moving to Town. Welcome to Hanley, we hope you enjoy your residence here. A great way to meet people is to get involved in the many different activities that are already established or if you have an idea to get people together, you can organize something new!

We are still looking for an Animal Control Officer. Please contact the Town Office for more info or to express your interest in this position.

Hanley Composite School

Teachers have been busy this fall settling into their rooms as the renovations continue at Hanley. We're very thankful for all the time and funding that Prairie Spirit School Division has been directing into our school, as there are a number of projects that were accomplished over the summer, some new ones started, and some projects still to be completed. The Home Ec lab and Industrial Arts shop are nearing completion this fall. Both were large projects that have taken significant time but the outcome will be something we will be thankful for in the future as I'm projecting larger PAA class sizes in the future.

The overhead power lines and communication lines that crossed the parking lot were trenched in and our school power potential was increased by 50%. Following that, the west front lawn was dug up and shaped to assist natural water drainage away from the school to the west. That meant a new sidewalk up to the elementary doors.

The east wing of the school that wasn't painted three years ago got a nice coat of paint, freshening up the walls and lockers. Our school colours now are accented around the halls and rooms and they look great.

The lower classrooms in the east wing are receiving new radiant heating systems to replace the electric baseboard heaters. They will be installed this fall up in the classroom ceilings and be covered by new ceiling systems and new light fixtures.

The balcony and some of the lower halls will receive some attention this fall as fifty year old construction work isn't good enough for today's standards. Students and staff have been adjusting well to not having that area accessible. Thank-you everyone for your patience in all our renovations. Also, thank-you to Kevin Foss from Prairie Spirit School Division and the guys from Con-Tech Construction for all their work here thus far and the remainder of the projects. We appreciate the attention to our school for all the improvements and the facelift.

I'll end this as I did in June. Please continue to keep the lines of communication open with us as we make the best choices we can for the education of your children. We invest a lot of ourselves in their growth and care about them and their success as much as you do. That's all for now. As always, Mr. Anderson and I would love to talk to you if you have time to drop by the office or give us a call. Take care and I'll talk to you soon.





WINTER IS COMING!

Even though some may not like to think about winter and using the "s" word, we all know it is right around the corner. With the weather still good, now would be the time to think about winterizing your mobile home by ensuring that the heat tape is securely and properly fastened and insulation added to your water pipes exposed to cold temperatures or drafts. Preventative maintenance to your home could also include: seal/caulk windows, doors, electrical outlets and ensure weather-stripping is in good condition; insulate wall cavities; maintain heating equipment according to manufacturer recommendations, inspect filters and piping for obstructions (dust, sludge, etc.); verify that dampers, vents and valves are in the proper positions, allowing for adequate air movement/water flow; know the locations of all water system piping (are lines contained in wall cavities or ceiling spaces that may experience colder temperatures than adjacent rooms?); keep portable electric heaters available. Note: Portable heaters should only be used as a last resort and a temporary solution. Ensure extension cord use is limited and that the heaters have tip-over protection and a thermostat. (SUMAssure Risk Control Services)

Then put your Christmas lights up while the weather is nice and you aren't freezing your fingers!
