In lieu of our regularly planned fall trade show that the Hanley Preschool has been hosting, and our current pandemic, we're going online and giving local and surrounding area artisans, bakers, independent small businesses (consultants) and more, the opportunity to post their goods here as a special event. This will hopefully provide an extra platform for these individuals/groups to help support them in selling their items during the Christmas shopping season. This event will be open from Nov 22 to Dec 5 at 2pm. Please note: this is not a buy and sell for used items.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

At our October meeting:

Animal Control Officer, Andrea Zwarich attended the meeting to discuss her role and expectations.

The maintenance report talked about an abandoned well that had been decommissioned in the 80's but was checked again by the Foreman. A draft employment contract was to be reviewed by solicitor Dellene Church.

Councillor McGregor reported on WaterWolf:

- The AGM was conducted virtually on Sept. 22;
- As the Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaws are being drafted, each municipality obtaining a new OCP & Zoning Bylaw are to review their past documents for changes;
- The newsletter and a document titled "What is WaterWolf" was provided on the tablets for informational purposes.

The Administrator reported:

- Having a meeting set up with SAL Engineering in the Industrial Park as Providence Grain is hoping to obtain Certificates of Completion from SAL;
- There have been many complaints in regards to parking at the Jubilee Court units. This has been deferred to the Manager of the Hanley Housing Authority.
- Having attended the September 16 DRWU regular meeting and a meeting on Sept. 24 with Minister Eyre, the Minister responsible for SaskWater and subsequent letter to the City of Saskatoon in regards to a levy that the City is proposing to charge new connections outside the city.
- The DRWU newsletter was attached to the tablets along with correspondence from the RV of Thode in regards to the 2014 Corporate Bylaw.

The occurrence statistics were reviewed from the RCMP.

The Campground financial statements were presented along with the water consumption for the Spray Park for the summer at 51,174 imperial gallons. If this was billed at \$23.75 (the current rate for 1,000 ig), the cost would total \$1,215.38.

After reviewing the correspondence to learn that the Government of Canada provided the Town with "Safe Restart" funding in the amount of \$30,483, the Council felt that funding in the amount of \$7,000 should go to the Hanley Arena, the Hanley Curling Club and the Hanley Centennial Community as each organization had a loss in revenue due to COVID-19 and have extra expenditures to provide for safely restarting each facility. The extra funds will assist with any extra expenditures the Town will recognize to ensure safety measures and additional cleaning are in place.

A document from SAMA was presented as 2021 will be a revaluation year where the assessments of each municipality being assessed by SAMA will be revalued.

Bylaws were adopted that included:

- Entering into agreement for a Planning District with other municipalities and the District is called "WaterWolf Planning District".
- An amendment was adopted for the Council Procedures to provide for the Administrative Assistant to be designated to call a special meeting if the position of the administrator is vacant or the administrator is unable to act;
- Supplementary Assessments will have a cut-off date of December 15th in each year;
- The Animal Control Bylaw, Schedules F, J & L were amended to remove the gymkhana area as an off-leash park; it was defined that the Animal Control Officer shall receive reimbursement of sustenance for impounded animals and be paid immediately upon receipt of remuneration request and the SSPCA was removed from the Authorization for Disposal form.

NOTES FROM THE TOWN OFFICE

The Policy for Public Inspection of documents was amended to include the Monthly Regular Meeting Agendas to be posted on the Town's webpage.

As Dorothy Gerbrandt has been publishing the Hermes for the past year as a volunteer, she was reimbursed for the Microsoft Publisher program.

The decision to remove the Fire Ban for the Town on September 23 was ratified.

Election Officials were to be provided for two meals on the Nov. 9 polling day.

To continue to qualify for the EI Premium Reduction Program, a resolution stating: "coverage for all regular full-time employees was amended to include short-term disability benefit with a taxable seven day waiting period effective Jan. 1/21" was approved.

The Council offered to the Hanley Centennial Community Centre, and the Hanley Arena to run power, energy and telephone bills through the Town so those facilities would not have to pay GST as the Town gets a GST rebate of 100%.

An uncollectible amount owing on a utility account was written off.

The SUMAssure insurance coverage application was renewed with the addition of the three radar signs.

An offer to purchase was refused.

Accounts in the amount of \$102,994.32 were approved.

The first meeting of the Council for the Town of Hanley is to be called by the Administrator after a General Election. The date of this meeting is set for November 23, 2020 at 7:00 pm in the Hanley Seniors' Clubroom. The Council will sign their Oath of Office and complete their Public Disclosure documents at the first meeting.

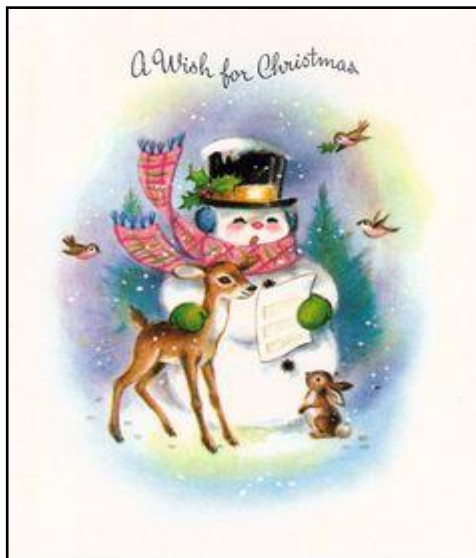

NOTICE OF ITEMS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN OF HANLEY TRANSFER STATION

In accordance with our permit and Loraas Disposal the following items will **NOT** be accepted at the transfer station:

1. Tires;
2. Hazardous wastes of any kind: pesticides, chemicals which are radioactive, reactive, toxic, ignitable, corrosive, pathological, acidic, etc., or any waste which is otherwise listed as a hazardous or toxic substance;
3. Petroleum, petroleum remains or by-products;
4. Fuel tanks or oil barrels;
5. Asbestos, concrete, rocks, wire;
6. Petroleum contaminated soils;
7. Automobiles and other large metal objects;
8. Remains of or by-products of slaughter house operations;
9. Liquid domestic sewage, used oil, liquid wastes and sludges generally;
10. Liquid paints and solvents (dried material and empty cans are OK in the Loraas bin);
11. Acid-filled automotive batteries;
12. Propane tanks;
13. Any wood products treated with creosote (telephone poles, wooden pilings, railroad ties, etc.)

There are designated areas for steel. ONLY TREES OR UNTREATED/UNPAINTED LUMBER MAY GO IN THE BURNING PIT. Contact the Town Office regarding bin rental.

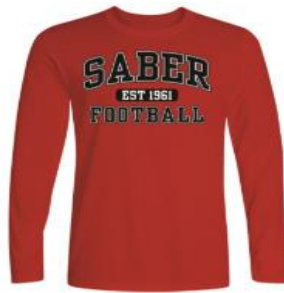
Our travel agent, Unity Travel, has been very supportive of our winners, working with them during this difficult time. Winners will have 1 year to book their trips or can take cash as their prize.

ANIMAL CONTROL

There has been a few comments or complaints about animal control not dealing with people who do not pick up their pet defecate.

In order to be able to do a citation, the owner has to be witnessed. If witnessed, the complainant would then be required to fill out a Bylaw infraction report. Pictures of action would be an asset.

Without a Bylaw infraction report there is no legal grounds to discuss anything with owner of pet.

A Bylaw infraction report needs to include:

Date of Occurrence: (yyyy/mm/dd)

Estimated Time of Occurrence:

Animal Description:

(include type, colour, size and license number if available)

Suspected Animal Caretaker: (if available)

Description of Incident:

Evidence Collected: (pictures, additional witnesses, video, audio recording)

Name of Complainant:

(will be kept confidential unless otherwise ordered by court of law)

Signature of Complainant.

Please be a **responsible** pet owner and keep your pets licensed, under control and cleaned up after!
